## **Summary**

Section 302(b) of the Act amends section 1847(e) (42 U.S.C. 1395w-3) --"Competitive Acquisition of Certain Items and Services," to include a demonstration project for clinical laboratory services. The demonstration must apply competitive acquisition for payment for clinical laboratory services, which would otherwise be made under Medicare Part B fee schedule. Under this statute, pap smears and colorectal screening tests are excluded from this demonstration. Requirements under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) as mandated in section 353 of the Public Health Service Act are applicable. The statute does not specify an implementation date. An initial report to Congress is due not later than December 31, 2005. Progress reports and final reports are required. The total amounts to be paid to contractors in a competitive acquisition area are expected to be less than the total amounts that would otherwise be paid. The payment basis determined for each competitive acquisition area will be substituted for the payment basis. Contracts are to be re-competed every 3 years, and multiple winners are expected in each competitive acquisition area. The statute does not specify the number or location of demonstration sites.
