**Abstract:** Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court. Papers dating chiefly from Warren's appointment as chief justice and relating principally to his activities with the Supreme Court and to the various landmark decisions identified with his tenure (1953-1969) in such areas as civil rights, race relations, criminal procedure, legislative reapportionment, freedom of speech and press, and church-state relations. Includes personal, family, and official correspondence; speeches and writings; Supreme Court files consisting of calendars, docket books, conference lists, bench memoranda, notes, opinions, and correspondence with associate justices; records relating to lower courts; and organizational files, scrapbooks, and other papers.

# **Scope and Content Note**

The papers of Earl Warren (1891-1974) span the years 1864 to 1974, with the bulk of the items concentrated in the period after 1953, when Warren became chief justice of the United States. The collection relates to private and public matters and includes six series. The <a href="Supreme Court File">Supreme Court File</a> and the <a href="Lower Courts File">Lower Courts File</a> series are further divided into subseries of various legal and functional categories containing Supreme Court opinions, <a href="docket books">docket books</a>, <a href="conference lists">conference lists</a> and <a href="bench memoranda">bench memoranda</a>, <a href="Judicial Conference">Judicial Conference</a> records, and <a href="correspondence">correspondence</a> with associate justices and federal district judges, plus numerous other records and papers concerning Warren's sixteen years on the Court. The <a href="Speeches and Writings">Speeches and Writings</a> series dates from 1942 when Warren ran for governor of California. Additional series include a <a href="Personal File">Personal File</a>, an <a href="Organizations File">Organizations File</a> treating Warren's

professional associations outside the Court, and an Oversize series containing scrapbooks documenting his Supreme Court years.

Warren rose from prosecutor in Alameda County, California, to state attorney general and then governor of California before attaining national recognition as Thomas E. Dewey's running mate in the presidential election of 1948. Four years later he sought nomination on the Republican ticket for president. That campaign, bitterly contested in the primaries between front-runners Dwight D. Eisenhower and Robert A. Taft, positioned Warren to succeed Chief Justice Fred M. Vinson. His first achievement was guiding the Supreme Court towards the unanimous *Brown v. Board of Education* desegregation decision. Thereafter came the sweeping changes augured by other "Warren Court" opinions, not only in the controversial area of race relations and civil rights but also in the realms of criminal procedure, the rights of indigent defendants, legislative reapportionment, freedom of speech and unpopular political affiliation, pornography, and religious expression in public schools.

The Personal File contains private and public correspondence as well as subject files and office records. Dating from the nineteenth century only because of a lone ancestral item sent to Warren by a distant relative, this series, like virtually the entire collection, begins basically in 1953. There is much personal material such as dinner invitations, family exchanges, holiday greetings, and political reminiscences and musings, but the focus is principally on Warren's service as chief justice. Various files treat his many trips abroad, daily calendars of his scheduled activities on and off the Court, correspondence regarding social occasions with foreign dignitaries, personal correspondence with the four presidents during whose terms he served, and photographs of Warren, his family, and his associates. Warren received numerous communications from politicians, journalists, legal scholars, entertainment leaders, and ordinary people across the country writing about decisions of the Court or important national and international events. Some of these letters are classified according to such topical categories as congratulations or regrets on eventful personal developments, but the majority can be found in alphabetical files under the writer's name.

The <u>Supreme Court File</u> covers nearly every operational and administrative aspect of the Warren Court, from the chief justice's jurisdiction over the offices of the <u>clerk</u>, the <u>marshal</u>, and the <u>reporter</u> to his recommendations about air-conditioning in the courtroom. Similar materials exist for the <u>lower federal courts</u>, with these files being generally intact from the mid-1940s and especially rich in <u>Judicial Conference</u> holdings. Located in the latter subseries are the basic data of the federal legal structure for the period. There are committee deliberations on appropriations, administrative procedure, legal ethics, personnel, habeas corpus, retirement of judges, bankruptcy rules, and congressional legislation as it affected the court system. Another subseries in the <u>Lower Courts File</u> consists of Warren's papers and records pertaining to <u>judges</u>. In this section are assignment folders, topical files, and correspondence which Warren exchanged with district court judges and others between 1953 and 1970. Among those whose correspondence appears frequently are Judges John Biggs, Jr., Charles Edward Clark, Irving R. Kaufman, John Johnston Parker, Orie Leon Phillips, and E. Barrett Prettyman.

The Supreme Court opinion files are organized as Warren's office arranged them according to whether an opinion was written by Warren or an associate justice or decided per curiam without an elaborate opinion. Warren's opinions include drafts from the first handwritten one through the final printed version. The opinion files as a whole contain memoranda exchanged between Warren and the other justices, briefs they circulated, background material they used or shared, and an occasional outside letter of comment about the cases. Also important is the separate correspondence file of letters between Warren and the associate justices. Supplemental to the justices' notes in the case files themselves, this subseries mixes everything from personal news and office trivia with discussions about the legal issues of the day and is an invaluable guide to the Court's collective mind and makeup, amounting when combined with the annotated conference lists, docket books, and bench memoranda, to a comprehensive account of Warren Court developments.

The <u>Speeches and Writings file</u> is the only segment of these papers to deal firsthand with Warren's career as governor and politician. Consisting mostly of transcripts or carbons rather than drafts or actual presentation copies, the speeches before 1953 feature three California gubernatorial campaigns and Warren's unsuccessful attempt to be vice president in 1948 and the Republican nominee for president in 1952. Those after 1953 include a greater variety of public appearances and contain manuscripts of talks in every stage of preparation as well as correspondence about the event and its impact.

Another series with information about Warren's public and professional activities outside the courtroom is the <u>Organizations</u> <u>File</u>, which documents his connections with law schools, legal societies, philanthropic agencies, his service as an ex officio member on the boards of the Smithsonian Institution, and the Harry S. Truman Library, and the President's Commission on the Assassination of President John F. Kennedy, which became known as the Warren Commission. The latter file consists mainly of correspondence reflecting the public's response to the findings of the Warren Commission.

Prominent and frequent correspondents include Warren's fellow justices on the Supreme Court: Hugo LaFayette Black, William J. Brennan, Harold H. Burton, Tom C. Clark, William O. Douglas, Abe Fortas, Felix Frankfurter, Arthur J. Goldberg, John M. Harlan, Robert Houghwout Jackson, Thurgood Marshall, Sherman A. Minton, Stanley Forman Reed, Potter Stewart, Byron R. White, and Charles Evans Whittaker. Important also are letters he received from presidents Harry S. Truman, Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy, Lyndon B. Johnson, and Richard M. Nixon. Other individuals whose names appear frequently in the collection are Edmund G. (Pat) Brown, Warren E. Burger, Edwin L. Carty, Louis Finkelstein, Paul Abraham Freund, Walter P. Jones, Goodwin Knight, Thomas H. Kuchel, Warren Olney III, Thomas M. Storke, and Benjamin Harrison Swig.

#### Container Series

## BOX 125-127 Agendas and Assignments, 1952-1969

Agendas and assignment charts and books.

Organized chronologically by term, with the assignment books separated by conference date and by justice and therein chronologically.

#### BOX 128-138 Arguments, 1968-1969

Transcripts of arguments before the Court during the October 1968 term.

Arranged alphabetically by case.

### BOX 139-151 Conference Lists, 1946-1949

Conference lists in typed, carbon, or other duplicated form with annotations and occasional notes by Warren or his law clerks.

Arranged chronologically by term.

### BOX 152-346 <u>Conference Memoranda</u>, 1953-1969

Bench memoranda prepared by clerks with annotations and emendations by Warren and his law clerks.

Organized chronologically by term and within the term in numerical order under four designations: appellate, miscellaneous, original, and sundry cases.

## BOX 347-366 Correspondence, 1953-1974

Incoming and outgoing letters with Warren E. Burger and other associate justices during Warren's tenure as chief justice and in retirement, with appended and related matter.

Arranged alphabetically by name of associate justice. Also, subgroups of sundry memoranda to the Court, general correspondence with the public regarding Court operations and general conduct, and correspondence outside the Court with respect to its decisions. The latter subgroups are organized chronologically.

## BOX 367-386 <u>Dockets</u>, 1953-1969

Court dockets.

Arranged chronologically by term and therein according to three principal categories: opinions handed down which cite cases by the name of the justice rendering the opinion; appellate, which cite them strictly by case number; and miscellaneous-original-sundry, also by case number.

#### BOX 387-398 Law Clerks, 1953-1974, n.d.

Correspondence, applications and other miscellaneous material relating to the clerks, their responsibilities, and personal ties to Warren.

Arranged alphabetically by type of material, with the applications arranged by term, and the correspondence by name of clerk.

## BOX 399-411 Office of the Clerk, 1930-1970

Administrative and financial matter regarding the operation of the clerk's office, including applications, memoranda and orders, fiscal reports, and personnel data.

Arranged alphabetically by subject or type of activity.

## BOX 412-416 Office of the Marshal, 1953-1974

Administrative and financial matter.

Arranged alphabetically according to subject or type of activity.

### **BOX** 417-418 **Office of the Reporter, 1953-1973**

Administrative files.

Arranged alphabetically according to subject, person, or type of activity.

#### BOX 419-569 Opinions--Associate Justice, 1953-1969

Case files of opinions written by associate justices, including circulated and annotated briefs in various stages of deliberation, memoranda and notes exchanged between Warren and other justices, and miscellaneous printed and other background material regarding the case.

Arranged chronologically by term and therein alphabetically by case.

### BOX 570-630 Opinions--Chief Justice, 1952-1969

Case files of opinions written by Warren, including holograph versions up to the final printed copy, with additional circulated briefs, memoranda and notes exchanged among the justices, and miscellaneous background material.

Arranged chronologically by term and therein alphabetically by case.

### BOX 631-654 Opinions--Per Curiam, 1953-1969

Case files of opinions written per curiam in various stages of deliberation up to the final printed copy and with occasional memoranda and background material.

Arranged chronologically by term and therein alphabetically by case. At the end of each term is a miscellaneous file of certiorari and appeals entered on order list.

## BOX 655-656 Rules, 1952-1968

Topical files of reports, memoranda, committee records, and miscellaneous data regarding amendments to judicial rules.

Arranged alphabetically by court or subject.

## **Subject File, 1940-1974**

Miscellaneous subject files of reports, correspondence, lists, charts, printed matter of all sorts, and other documents.

Arranged alphabetically by topic.

## **Lower Courts File, 1942-1974**

## BOX 668-671 Administrative Office, 1946-1968

Subject and operational files including correspondence, memoranda, budget materials, personnel data, and other documents.

Arranged alphabetically by subject, person, or type of material.

#### BOX 671-673 Circuit Conferences, 1953-1974

Correspondence, memoranda, and related material concerning the planning and holding of Circuit Judicial Conferences.

Arranged according to specific circuit court and therein chronologically.

#### BOX 674-675 Federal Judicial Center, 1967-1970

Correspondence, reports, and other committee records pertaining to the creation of the Federal Judicial Center.

Arranged alphabetically by subject or type of material.

## BOX 676-693 **Judges, 1945-1970**

Assignment correspondence, conference reports, general correspondence between Warren and lower court judges with miscellaneous subject files concerning the federal courts.

Arranged alphabetically by topic or type of material.

## **BOX** 694-753 **Judicial Conference**, **1942-1974**

Correspondence, memoranda, reports, minutes, subject files, printed matter, committee records, and other documents relating to the operations and policies of the United States Judicial Conference.

Arranged alphabetically by committee, subject, or type of material.

## **BOX** 754-786 **Organizations File, 1939-1974**

Correspondence, memoranda, reports, minutes, printed matter, and miscellaneous items concerning professional organizations and institutions of which Warren was a member or participant, including his chairmanship of the commission to investigate the death of John F. Kennedy.

Organized alphabetically by name of organization or institution.

#### **Speeches and Writings, 1942-1974**

Drafts of speeches, remarks, statements, and writings along with related correspondence, background material, scheduling material, and printed matter.

Speeches given as governor of California, as chief justice, or in retirement arranged under those headings and therein chronologically. Press statements and writings arranged chronologically.

## BOX 847-858 Oversize, 1953-1969

Clippings in scrapbooks organized by Warren's Supreme Court office staff.

Arranged in approximate chronological order.

#### BOX CL 1 Classified, 1959-1967

Classified material consisting mostly of memoranda, letters, and speeches.

Organized and described according to the series, folders, and boxes from which the items were removed.
