

The following is a brief explanation of the problem found with each of the least acceptable products, as well as any other USDA donated commodities that CSFP participants would like to see improved.

Problem Code Table

- 1. **Overall Product Evaluation** program recipients do not like; too labor intensive.
- 2. Nutrition too much fat, grease, salt/sodium, and/or sugar.
- 3. **Quality** bad taste/flavor; poor texture; too tough; strong aroma/smell; cookability/meltability problems; or poor appearance.
- 4. **Delivery/Timing** damaged packages/products; timeliness of deliveries.
- 5. **Packaging** poor quality or wrapping; pack size too small; or pack size too large.
- 6. Other (see "Additional Comments" block).

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) General Comments/Recommendations

MEATS

- •Many clients would like to get canned turkey for the winter holidays (we already give pumpkin and sweet potatoes).
- •Would like to see more pork items.
- •All canned meats have too much fat/grease and too much sodium.

MEAT ALTERNATES

- •Dried beans bags that are commercially labeled seem more sturdy than USDA generic bags.
- •The most popular product is the cheese.
- Love the cheese.

FRUITS

- •Many seniors want more than three cans of juice in their monthly packages.
- •The asceptic (carton) grape juice was damage-prone during all phases of food distribution.
- •Grape juice in cartons has better flavor. Grape juice in carton is excellent.

All fruit juices should be in cartons.

- •Allow more fruit and less fruit juices.
- •Juice cans are heavy and hard to manage.
- •Would like more fruit.

VEGETABLES

- •Would like to receive canned mixed vegetables.
- •All canned vegetables are too salty.

GRAINS

- •Plastic bags for grits and oatmeal are greatly preferable to paper bags.
- •Two boxes of cereal are too much each month.
- •Would like to receive oatmeal (instant hot cereal).
- Some cereal boxes damaged.
- •Would like to receive smaller boxes of cereal.
- •Would Like to receive smaller pack size of grits.

OTHERS

- Many seniors want more than three cans of evaporated milk in the monthly packages.
- •Almost all clients like the bonus chocolate and vanilla pudding.
- •Some seniors are interested in an Ensure-type supplement in the package.
- Participants love the chocolate and vanilla puddings.
- •Thank you for the pudding it is wonderful.
- •Love the pudding.
- •Would like to receive more varieties of salad dressing.

DoD FRESH PRODUCE

- •Some clients would like to receive fresh vegetables.
- •Would like to receive fresh potatoes, fruits, and vegetables.

MISCELLANEOUS

- •Bonus items requested for return: asparagus; salmon; raisins (on order); trail mix (on order); dried plums (prunes).
- •Some seniors have requested flour, butter, and corn meal in their packages.
- •Don't stop the program- I don't know what we can do without it.
- •Many responded how grateful they were because they are not eligible for food stamps.
- •Increase caseload.
- •Increase items in "box" to include meats, fruits, and vegetables.
- •Increase monthly bonus items to two or three per month.
- •People would be interested in receiving canned soups such as tomato, vegetable, chicken noodle, and small bottles of cooking oil.
- •Seniors, like me, need to watch their diet, and some products have a lot of sugar in them.
- •Glad for the food but need more variety.
- •Too many cans of juice for me--I live alone.
- •Everything is good and excellent.
- •Clients like program, and want to thank everybody for being so helpful and nice.
- •"Great program." "Can't live without it." "So glad to get the food. I feel very privileged." "Food boxes make our month"
- •"Just wonderful to get food." "Happy and helpful to get through every month."
- "Very happy to get box, use everything."
- •"Wonderful to get great food." "Helps the food budget." "Food is a God saver."
- "Helps me stretch food budget."
- •"Keeps food in the house and I really need it." "So happy to get food good quality." "Helps us out a lot."
- •It is very difficult for the elderly, who are on a fixed income, to make ends meet. Unfortunately they are often faced with the problem of either buying food this month or buying their medicine this month. This is an unfortunate reality that the senior population of this country face every month.
- •Overall participants love the program; not many complaints.
- •Overall a majority of our clients are very satisfied with CSFP.
- •The least favorite choices were a matter of taste. No problems with quality food items.
