## INSPECTION FREQUENCY

A traveling exhibitor must be inspected frequently enough to ensure the health and well-being of the animals.

## Criteria

A traveling exhibitor must be inspected at least twice every calendar year:

- once at his/her home facility, **AND**
- once on the road

A traveling exhibitor's **home inspector** is responsible for:

- ensuring that the traveling exhibitor is inspected at least twice a year as required
- obtaining an itinerary from the traveling exhibitor
- discussing with his/her SACS who will contact the appropriate inspector, if necessary, to conduct the on-theroad inspection
- providing the other inspector with the appropriate paperwork, such as:
  - itinerary with dates and location of the exhibit
  - > previous on-the-road inspection
  - previous home facility inspection, if applicable
  - other pertinent information by mail, fax, or Laserfiche, including but not limited to:
    - □ variances□ memos□ photographs
- conducting a reinspection(s) for noncompliances, if possible, or
- discussing with his/her SACS how a follow up on-the-road inspection will be conducted

If you (the home inspector) have trouble getting an on-the-road inspection, contact your SACS.

The **inspector conducting the on-the-road inspection** is responsible for:

• sending a copy of the inspection report and itinerary to his/her SACS or Regional Office with the weekly

## paperwork

- conducting a reinspection(s) if:
  - a serious or direct NCI was cited, and
  - the exhibitor is still in his/her area
- contacting his/her SACS to help coordinate the follow-up inspection if:
  - a serious or direct NCI was cited, and
  - the exhibitor is moving out of his/her area

NOTE: If you encounter an exhibitor and that exhibitor has been inspected within 90 days and had a clean inspection, you should not conduct an inspection unless you are following up on a complaint or see a "direct" noncompliance.

17.2.2 ANIMAL CARE
