The species and activity involving the animal determines whether or not a person requires a USDA license.			
Exemption	The Secretary of Agriculture has exempted activities involving the following animals from the licensing requirements:  • rats of the genus <i>Rattus</i> bred for use in research  • mice of the genus <i>Mus</i> bred for use in research  • birds  • domestic equine species such as:  > horses  > ponies  > miniature horses  > mules  > donkeys/asses  NOTE: This equine species exemption does not include exotic species such as zebras and Przewalski's horses.
