Ms. Christine Guay and Mr. José Luis Samaniego represented Canada and Mexico respectively. Ms. Regina Barba, Chair of JPAC, represented JPAC and Ms. Janine Ferretti, Executive Director, the Secretariat. Mr. Marc Paquin, Secretary to Council, acted as secretary of the session. Other officials of the Parties and the Secretariat also participated in the call.

## Item 1 Adoption of the agenda

Ms. Barba indicated that the next JPAC Regular Session will take place in Guadalajara, Mexico on 23-24 March, following a workshop with representatives of indigenous communities organized by the Conservation of Biodiversity Program, that will be attended by the JPAC working group on indigenous people.
