SESSION 99-01 OF ALTERNATE REPRESENTATIVES SUMMARY RECORD

The Council, represented by the Alternate Representatives, met via conference call on 6 and 8 January 1999. Ms. Norine Smith (Canada) chaired the meeting. Mr. José Luis Samaniego and Mr. William Nitze represented Mexico and the United States, respectively. Mr. Jonathan Plaut, represented JPAC and Ms. Janine Ferretti, Interim Executive Director, represented the Secretariat. Mr. Marc Paquin, Council Secretary, was the session secretary. Other officials from the Parties and the Secretariat were also in attendance.

Item 1 Adoption of the agenda

The Alternate Representatives adopted the agenda for the session based on the provisional agenda (Annex A).

Item 2 Approval of the 1999-2001 Program Plan

The Alternate Representatives approved the 1999-2001 Program Plan of the CEC. They also approved the Summary of a North American Agenda for Action: 1999-2001, subject to the revision by the Secretariat, with the General Standing Committee (GSC), of the section outlining what will be the achievements of the CEC by the end of the first three-year period, that is the year 2001.

Item 3 Review of the 1999 Annual Program and Budget

The Alternate Representatives approved the 1999 Annual Program and Budget of the CEC with the understanding that the GSC will verify all necessary text changes to the descriptions that require modifications. It was also agreed that the GSC would develop a project description for the Environmental Education/CICEANA, to reflect the discussions held by the Alternates (see discussion Item 9 below).

Item 4 Report by the Interim Executive Director

In her report, the Interim Executive Director indicated that the Parties and the Secretariat now need to undertake the preparation of the next regular session of the Council to be held in June 1999, focusing on the identification of the potential announcements for that session.

As well, she presented to the Alternate Representatives the grid of Council decisions prepared by the Secretariat to facilitate follow-up of Council decisions.

The Interim Executive Director reported on a recent agreement between the CEC and the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) whereby the ICAO will assist the CEC in the development of job descriptions for existing posts which will then serve to establish a job classification system. She also reported that the selection process for the Communications Coordinator was underway with interviews scheduled to take place in March 1999.

Item 5 Statement by the Chair of JPAC

The Chair of JPAC indicated that JPAC had made its report at the last session of Alternate Representatives held 16-17 December 1998.

Item 6 Approval of summary records

The Alternate Representatives approved the summary record of session 98-08 and the record of discussion of the conference call of 9 October 1998 with KPMG (98-E).

Item 7 Negotiations of the North American Agreement on Transboundary Environmental Impact Assessment

The Alternate Representatives discussed the status of the negotiations of the Agreement. They further agreed to explore the feasibility of including TEIA as a potential announcement for the US-Mexico and Canada-US bilaterals to be held in February 1999.

Item 8 Process and timeframe for finalizing the Public Participation Guidelines

The Alternate Representatives reviewed and approved the process and time frame developed by the Secretariat and adopted by JPAC for the preparation of Public Participation Guidelines of the CEC.

Item 9 Update by the Secretariat and the Parties on financial issues

The Secretariat provided the Parties with a financial update on the 1997 and 1998 budgets as well as 1997 surplus and 1998 forecast surplus, indicating that each Party has about US \$60,000 of surplus funds. Canada indicated that its domestic financial rules require that any surplus owed to Canada be credited against its contribution for the following year or reimbursed to it. The Secretariat indicated that Mexico's surplus amount would be applied toward its unpaid contributions, to which Mexico did not agree, considering that this would contravene Council Resolution 98-10. The Alternate Representatives asked the Secretariat to hold further discussions with Mexico regarding any surplus owed to Mexico. Finally, the United States indicated that the US \$60,000 surplus funds owed to the United States should be allocated as follows: US \$30,000 to the Persistent Bioaccumulative and Toxic substances transport activity under the SMOC project and US \$30,000 to the Environmental Education/CICEANA proposal. It was agreed that if the Environmental Education/CICEANA proposal were to be funded, this would be the last allocation for CICEANA and that the project description must build from previous CEC work on environmental education with a clear link to the CEC work program. Mexico decided to apply its surplus funds to CICEANA.

On the status of its contributions, Mexico indicated that, as a result of the fluctuation in the exchange rate, the resources provided to cover its contribution to the CEC will generally be subject to losses upon the exchange of pesos in dollars. In 1997, its contribution amounted to US \$2,529,000, and to US \$2,757,000 for 1998. The Secretariat noted that Mexico had an excess in its contribution account of US \$81,000 at the end of 1996 and that during 1997 it was credited with its share of the 1995 surplus which amounted to US \$68,000.

The Secretariat was asked to prepare an analytical paper to provide the Alternate Representatives of a comprehensive update of the financial situation of the CEC in relation to the Parties contributions.

Item 10 Agreement with the Province of Québec, including tax reimbursement

Canada indicated it is continuing its internal discussions on the matter and is hopeful to be able to report progress on the matter at the next session of Alternate Representatives.

Item 11 US Income Tax – Status reimbursement

United States indicated that it should be in a position to report on the progress made in this matter by the time of the next session of the Alternate Representatives.

Item 12 NAAEC Part V Model Rules of Procedures

The Alternate Representatives confirmed the attendance of their respective delegations to the meeting on Models Rules for Part V of NAAEC scheduled from 1 to 5 February 1999 in Mexico City. Mexico further indicated that it is currently working on the preparatory logistical arrangements for that meeting and that it will inform the Parties and the Secretariat of the details as soon as they are finalized.

Item 13 Spanish Version of CEC Rules

The Alternate Representatives agreed to instruct the responsible individuals that they meet and finalize the Spanish version of the rules in time for their adoption at the next session of Alternate Representatives. In order to do so an initial conference call is to be scheduled in the week of 11 January.

Item 14 Date and venue for the 1999 Regular Session of the Council

Canada indicated that it expected to be in a position to confirm next week the precise location for the 1999 Regular Session of the Council scheduled 28-29 June 1999. Nevertheless, Canada indicated that the meeting would definitely take place in Alberta.

Item 15 Scheduling of next sessions of Alternate Representatives

The Alternate Representatives agreed to hold their next session via conference call on Wednesday, 27 January 1999 at 4:00 PM EST (3:00 PM Central) to discuss, inter alia, the critical path and the potential announcements for the regular session of the Council to be held next June.

They further agreed to hold the next environment and trade officials meeting and an Alternate Representatives session on 8 and 9 March 1999, pending availability of their trade counterparts.

Item 16 Other issues

No other issues were discussed.

Item 17 Closure of the session

The Chairperson closed the session.
