"To be able to drink directly from the Yukon River"


Created in 1997 by the Tribes and First Nations of The Yukon to clean up and protect the River.

Program Overview

WATER QUALITY/SCIENCE PROGRAM

Conducts scientific research and provides for water quality testing and supervision of a riverwide monitoring effort.

GIS MAPPING PROGRAM

Location, mapping and recording of contaminants throughout the watershed.

EDUCATION PROGRAM

Our river-wide environmental education program engages Tribal, K-12 schools and municipal groups.

SOLID WASTE PROGRAM Addresses landfill and sewage

Addresses landfill and sewage matters.

BACKHAUL PROGRAM

Provides for the removal of environmental contaminants from the watershed communities, which include:
