## SESSION 98-09 OF ALTERNATE REPRESENTATIVES

# SUMMARY RECORD

The Council, represented by the Alternate Representatives, met via conference call on 16 and 17 December 1998. Ms. Norine Smith (Canada) chaired the meeting. Mr. José Luis Samaniego and Mr. William Nitze represented Mexico and the United States, respectively. Mr. Jonathan Plaut, represented JPAC and Ms. Janine Ferretti, Interim Executive Director, represented the Secretariat. Mr. Marc Paquin, Council Secretary, was the session secretary. Other officials from the Parties and the Secretariat were also in attendance.

### Item 1 Adoption of the agenda

The agenda for the session was adopted at the beginning of the session based on the provisional agenda (Annex A).

### Item 2 Approval of the 1999-2001 Program Plan

The Alternate Representatives discussed many projects and proposed changes to their description and budget. The agreed upon changes will be reflected in the next version of the 3-year Program Plan and of the 1999 Annual Program and Budget.

More specifically, the discussions focussed on the following projects:

- 1) Emerging Trends in North America: approved;
- 2) Regional Cooperation in support of the Clean Development Mechanism: approved pending inclusion of modifications;
- 3) NAFTA Environmental Effects: to be redrafted and circulated;
- 4) Facilitating Conservation of Biodiversity as it relates to Trade in Wildlife Species: approved pending inclusion of modifications
- 5) North American Biodiversity Conservation Mechanisms: approved pending inclusion of modifications
- 6) Sound Management of Chemicals: approved pending inclusion of modifications.

Mr. Jonathan Plaut, on behalf of the Chair of JPAC, provided a summary of the JPAC activities

In that regard he focused on the JPAC meeting held 3-4 December 1998 in Washington and highlighted the following Advice to Council developed by JPAC during that session: Advice 98-07 recommending the approval of the CEC Annual Program and Budget for 1999 at the current session of Alternate Representatives; Advice 98-08 urging Council to actively promote the implementation of Article 10(6) of NAAEC; Advice 98-09 recommending that further attention be paid to Enforcement issues and Compliance indicators; Advice 98-10 reiterating JPAC's interest in continuing to participate in the selection process for the Executive Director of the CEC. He also summarized the outcome of the Round Table on the Three Year Plan conducted by JPAC during that meeting.

While recognizing the value of the integral version of the State of the Environment report for reference purposes, Mr. Plaut recommended the issuance of a 50-page summary of the report for wider distribution.

Mr. Plaut also reported on the attendance of JPAC members at recent meetings of the Enforcement Working Group and NAFTA Environmental Effects Peer Reviewers held 1 and 2 December 1998, respectively. He concluded by giving a preview of JPAC activities in the coming months such as the upcoming workshop on Articles 14 -15 Revised Guidelines scheduled 29 January 1999 in Montreal and the JPAC Regular Session scheduled on 25-26 March 1999 in Mexico City.
