IMPORT REQUIREMENTS OF IVORY COAST FOR BOVINE EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate (VS Form 17-140) issued by a veterinarian so authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and consignee, and complete identification of the animals to be exported. Additional information shall include:

CERTIFICATION STATEMENT:

1. The United States is free of foot-and-mouth disease.

TEST RESULTS:

- 1. Brucellosis standard tube test negative 1:50.
- 2. Tuberculosis caudal intradermal test mammalian PPD negative.
- 3. Bovine leucosis AGID test negative.
- 4. Paratuberculosis caudal intradermal test negative.
- 5. Negative culture genital swab for vibriosis and trichomoniasis.
- 6. Anaplasmosis CF test negative.

EMBARKATION STATEMENT:

At the port of embarkation, a VS port veterinarian shall attach to the Origin Health Certificate the "Certificate of Inspection of Export Animals" (VS Form 17-37) showing:

- (a) The name and address of the consignor.
- (b) The name and address of the consignee.
- (c) The number and species of animals to be shipped.
- (d) A statement that the animals "have been given a careful veterinary inspection at the port of embarkation and found to be free from evidence of communicable disease and exposure thereto" (within 24 hours of exportation).
