IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF MEXICO FOR DOGS AND CATS EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

Pet Dogs and Cats:

- 1. The animals must be accompanied by a health certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian. Health certificates for personal pets do not need to be endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian.
- 2. The animals must be inoculated against rabies (unless younger than 4 months old) and distemper (dates of vaccination must appear on the health certificate).
- 3. The health certificate must be in duplicate and bear the name and address of the owner, a description of the animal (species, age, sex) and attest that the animal has been examined and found free of any contagious disease.

Commercial shipments of dogs and cats:

1. The animals must be accompanied by a health certificate (such as the APHIS form 7001 or old VS Form 18-1, or a State health certificate) issued by a USDA-accredited veterinarians and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian.

2. Certification Statements:

- (i) The animals were inspected and found free of any evidence of infectious diseases and parasites.
- (ii) The animals originate from kennels where no outbreaks of hemorrhagic gastroenteritis have occurred.
- (iii) The animals were vaccinated against rabies, distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis, and parvovirus. Show date of vaccination and product used a vaccination certificate must accompany the animals.
