IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF MEXICO FOR ZOOLOGICAL ANIMALS EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by U.S Origin Health Certificate issued by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of both the consignor and the consignee, and individual identification of the animals to be exported. Additional information shall include:

CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS

- 1. The animals resided in the United States continuously for at least 6 months and have not shown any signs of parasitic or infectious diseases.
- 2. The animals were examined and found to be clinically healthy and free of ectoparasites.

OTHER INFORMATION

- 1. All animals may be inspected by a Mexican veterinarian at a facility in the United States at one of the following border points: Brownsville, Texas; Laredo, Texas; Del Rio, Texas; Eagle Pass, Texas; El Paso, Texas; Presidio, Texas, Columbus, New Mexico; San Luis, Arizona; Nogales, Arizona; Calexico, California.
- 2. The U.S. origin health certificate must be typewritten. Handwritten certificates will be rejected by the Mexican Animal Health authorities.
