## IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF PAKISTAN FOR HORSES EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate issue by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services (VS) veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and the consignee and a complete identification of the animals to be exported. Additional information shall include:

## **CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS**

- 1. The United States has never been affected with African horse sickness and vaccination against this disease is prohibited in the United States.
- 2. The United States has been free of glanders since 1942 and the mallein test is not practiced in the United States.
- 3. The United States is free of dourine and all other diseases caused by trypanosomes.
- 4. The United Stated is free of epizootic lymphangitis.

## TEST REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Equine infectious anemia: Agar-gel immunodiffusion test within 30 days of export.
- 2. Equine piroplasmosis: Complement-fixation test within 30 days of export.

## EMBARKATION STATEMENT

At the port of embarkation, a VS port veterinarian shall attach to the Origin Health Certificate the Certificate of Inspection of Export Animals (VS Form 17-37) showing:

- 1. The name and address of the consignor.
- 2. The name and address of the consignee.
- 3. The number and species of animals to be shipped.
- 4. A statement that the animals have been given a careful veterinary inspection at the port of embarkation and found free from evidence of communicable disease and exposure thereto within 24 hours of exportation.
