## IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF PAKISTAN FOR HORSES EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate issue by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services (VS) veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and the consignee and a complete identification of the animals to be exported. Additional information shall include:

### CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS

1. The United States has never been affected with African horse sickness and vaccination against this disease is prohibited in the United States.
2. The United States has been free of glanders since 1942 and the mallein test is not practiced in the United States.
3. The United States is free of dourine and all other diseases caused by trypanosomes.
4. The United States is free of epizootic lymphangitis.

### TEST REQUIREMENTS

1. Equine infectious anemia: Agar-gel immunodiffusion test within 30 days of export.
2. Equine piroplasmiasis: Complement-fixation test within 30 days of export.

### EMBARKATION STATEMENT

At the port of embarkation, a VS port veterinarian shall attach to the Origin Health Certificate the Certificate of Inspection of Export Animals (VS Form 17-37) showing:

1. The name and address of the consignor.
2. The name and address of the consignee.
3. The number and species of animals to be shipped.
4. A statement that the animals have been given a careful veterinary inspection at the port of embarkation and found free from evidence of communicable disease and exposure thereto within 24 hours of exportation.
