IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF GREECE FOR SWINE EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

Each animal shall be identified on the Origin Health Certificate (VS 17-140) showing sex, age, breed, and ear tag. Importation of breeding animals requires prior approval of the Veterinary Services of the Greek Ministry of Agriculture.

Animals and their dams were born and raised until shipment to Greece on premises of origin.

Animals originate from premises which are free from brucellosis, hog cholera (classical swine fever), and foot-and-mouth disease and are clinically free from pseudorabies (Aujesky's disease), atrophic rhinitis, and swine influenza during the last year.

Animals originate from premises on which no cases of African swine fever have ever been recorded.

Premises of origin and port of embarkation, as well as surrounding areas within a 10-kilometer radius, were free of contagious diseases listed in O.I.E. List A (see 592.101) during the 30 days prior to shipment. Bedding also originates from an area free of diseases listed in O.I.E. List A.

Animals were negative to sero-agglutination test for brucellosis (1:50 dilution) within 30 days prior to date of movement of animals for export from premises of origin.

Animals must be transported in vehicles cleaned and disinfected with an approved disinfectant since last used for animals.

Animals to be exported have not been fed garbage at any time.
