Article 11.4.1.

General provisions

Standards for diagnostic tests are described in the Terrestrial Manual.

Article 11.4.2.

Recommendations for the importation of fresh meat of cattle

Veterinary Authorities of importing countries should require the presentation of an international veterinary certificate attesting that the entire consignment of meat:

- comes from animals which have been slaughtered in an approved abattoir and have been subjected to ante-mortem and post-mortem inspections for bovine cysticercosis with favourable results;
- 2. has been recognised as being free from bovine cysticercosis; or
- 32. in cases of moderate infestation, has been processed using one of the methods provided in the "Recommended International Code of Practice for *ante-mortem* and *post-mortem* judgement of slaughter animals and meat", namely: freezing or heat treatment at 60°C (140°F) (FAO/WHO Codex Alimentarius Commission CAC/RCP 34-1985).

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
