



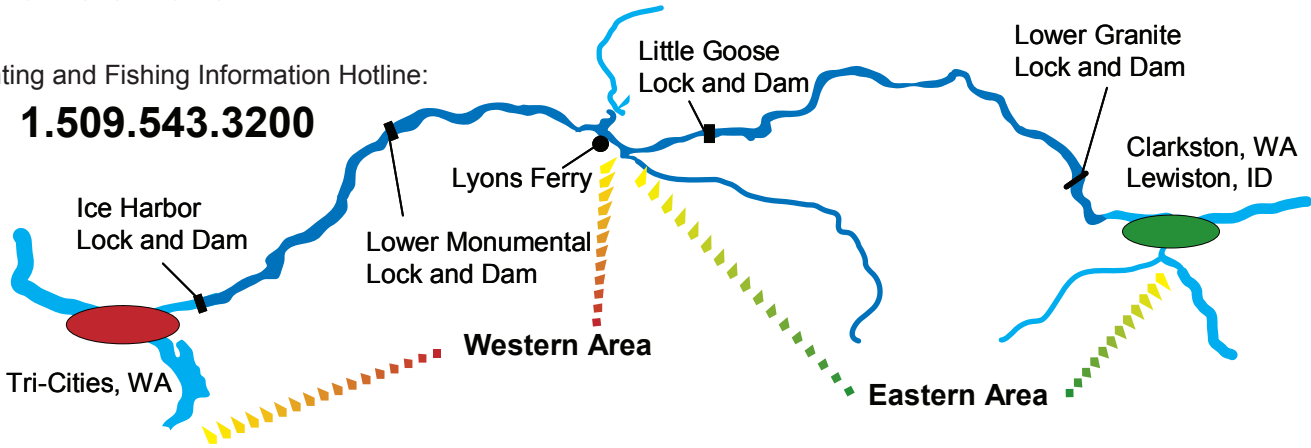

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Lower Snake River Hunting

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers invites you to visit your public lands that we manage in southeastern Washington. More than 20,000 acres of lands are open to hunting. In addition, many campgrounds operated by the Corps and its lessees are open throughout the fall months with some limitations on services. While we manage primarily for upland game and waterfowl, many areas along the Snake River have very good deer hunting. In most places, our ownership is limited to a fairly narrow band of land along the river, so deer hunters are advised to secure adjacent private land access when hunting from public lands along the lower Snake River. Please respect the rights of our adjacent private landowners. Pre-season scouting is highly advised. Hunters should be prepared for somewhat crowded conditions on these intensively developed sites during the first few weeks of the season and around holidays.
