#### II. REVIEW AND ADOPTION OF AGENDA:

The agenda was reviewed and adopted with modification (added CDR Blackwell to speak at Strategic Growth Committee Report time), following motion by CDR Balash and 2<sup>nd</sup> by CDR Manrique. Voice vote per roll call was obtained.

#### III. REVIEW AND ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS TPAC MINUTES:

Meeting minutes of Dec 17, 2004 meeting had been provided via e-mails to all TPAC members and were approved via e-mail by all members. Minutes were posted to TPAC Web site on Jan 18, 2005. Acclamation vote was obtained (in essence of time) for approval of minutes as posted, following a motion by CDR Balash and 2<sup>nd</sup> by CDR Payne.

#### Invited Speaker RDML Babb, OFRD

Admiral Babb thanked the therapist category for inviting him to speak at the TPAC Meeting. Category currently has 65% officer basic ready qualified. He congratulated the category in being the leader for basic readiness gualified officers both overall and also those who were promotion eligible, and that number was 75%. Another date to remember is May 01, 2005, if promotion eligible, the name will not go forward for promotion if not basic ready qualified. He recognized that the therapist along with other categories like, dieticians, optometrists, scientists etc. in their traditional clinical roles do not historically get deployed due to reasons beyond his control. The request for resources comes from the State Health Agencies to HHS to ASPHEP to OFRD. The requestor instead of asking for skill sets, ask for professions, like Nurses, MD's etc. For therapists to be competitive in deployment, more untraditional roles need to be selected like, safety officer, liaison officer, SNS officer etc. He gave examples of other category officers on deployments, performing duties other than their traditional professional duties, which are now considered within the scope of their practice in some states. Like Optometrists prescribing and pharmacists doing vaccinations. Psychologists, on the other hand do not have such privileges given to them by any state but they would like to have the privilege to prescribe on deployments that is not being entertained. He recognized the therapist capabilities and commended the OT's for a superb performance during the Hurricanes despite some questions from the Red Cross. He advised that the category must make efforts to educate state agencies in the therapist capabilities in situations like disasters where the therapist skills would be invaluable in providing expert wound care, musculoskeletal evaluations and management and mental health services.

In the coming months there will be new roles available for deployment which will be related to the team approach. There is a plan underway from ASPHEP regarding the deployment of Federal Medical Contingency Stations. These facilities are low acuity and OFRD will have much more flexibility to staff these stations with officers with specific skill sets. This is in response to the letter from the Secretary to the ASH and the OSG where officers would deploy in tiers. A core group of 500 officers within 4 hours, 1/3 Corps in next 24 hours and the rest in 48 hours, with further supplement from inactive reserves if needed. He further informed that a process is being developed by which officers will have an opportunity to select at least two deployment roles.

With regards to the new accessions the plan still is to have a BOTC before going to the duty station which will make those officers basic ready qualified. The first class is scheduled for July. Also the intent is that there will be an automated notification of any items that are about to expire and the officer should plan ahead. The time frame for this automation is not definite at this time.

#### IV. REPORTS

#### A. CPO Report

CAPT McGarvey presented the following report:

The 6<sup>th</sup> Precept, update: All groups from CPO boards, SGPAC and agency heads did not support the institution of the 6<sup>th</sup> precept. However, OCCFM submitted a memorandum to the ASH with a prepared manual circular for the ASH's signature to institute the 6<sup>th</sup> precept without the SG's approval or support. There are now meetings being scheduled to address this issue.

Transformation update: The transformation packet is on the Secretary's desk and has not yet been signed.

Recruitment update: A contract has been awarded to market the Commissioned Corps and improve recruitment to fill the large void that we have in many OP-DIVs.

NIH Ethical Issues: Many scientists have come under scrutiny in regards to unethical practices relating to pharmaceutical companies.

COSTEP program at Army Baylor: CAPT Furman has not been available to address the issue for increased time commitment for students at the Army Baylor program which now is doctorate level. It appears that there will not be any PHS students in the COSTEP program this year at the Army Baylor physical therapy program.

CPO Board update: Very active in a number of reviews of various items, he will share them with the category as the information is available.

He answered question about the civil service therapist participation at the meetings and other activities that are traditionally CO activities. He recommended that this could be brought up to the OSG for a clearer definition, if the PAC so desires. Though there is much value in having the civil service therapists but most activities within the PAC are commission officer oriented.

He also answered question regarding the Warrant Officer program that is will be positive addition to the Corps. It is not fully approved yet but once approved it will go to OMB for approval. He also addressed the career pathway issue for the PTA's and the COTA's coming in as Warrant Officers. Nurse will have a commissioning program by which they two year associate degree holders will be sent to complete their BSN to be fully commissioned. He informed that at present time to maximum shortage is in the Nursing category, hence this will be implemented right away for nurses but speculated that the same program will be available to other professions. Like therapist assistants, if at a later time they would wish to go to becoming licensed therapists should have such an opportunity. But at this time primarily the focus is on Nursing.

#### B. TPAC Chair Report

CDR Gaustad is very actively involved in the WO work group. There have been four meetings thus far, one scheduled next week and the next two in March and April. He too commented similarly on the WO program and that it would be a very positive addition to the Commissioned Corps. There are 11 Professions identified as possibles for the WO program. More will follow.

Passing away of a former Therapist officer: CDR (Ret) Edward Koziatek, PT. He was assigned to the USCG at the last assignment, retired in 1996. He passed away on December 16, 2004 in New London, Connecticut.

CDR Lois Goode was recently named the Rehab Chief Clinical Consultant for the Indian Health Service. She was invited to make comments and she first thanked CDR Martha Duganne for five years of remarkable leadership and support to the Indian health Service not only as the Rehab services consultant but also advocate of other services and the underserved areas. Many Continuing Educational programs have been implemented in the IHS also developed a reporting system for sharing information in the twelve regional IHS areas. She also thanked the regional heads for timely sharing of the information which gets shared up and down the chain. She will be attending the National Council of Chief's meeting in two weeks following that she will pass along the information with regards to IHS plan. Her goal is to get information on staffing, urban clinics. She asked officer to contact her any time with questions regarding IHS plans, issues etc. (Letter from TPAC Chair is attached)

#### **Committee reports: (Written Reports are attached)**

**Administration Committee:** CDR Shapiro reported that the admin committee has been active with the Elections and with COA 2005 planning. Election ballots have been sent out and we are currently awaiting the ballot return. Hopefully we will be able to announce preliminary results at the April meeting. Final results as always are after the approval from OSG. A full committee report is attached.

#### COA 2005 Task Force

CDR Shapiro reported that the COA Task Force has finalized the Category day agenda that was submitted to CAPT McGarvey and CDR Gaustad for approval before it is published in the COA Brochures. We will have a very busy but productive category day with excellent speakers as well as retirement ceremony, awards and paper presentations. We are still awaiting the final word from the HSO Category regarding the evening social event. The BMI booth also has been finalized and CDR Drinkard will give an update on that issue.

**Information Management Committee:** LCDR Newman thanked CAPT Siegel for her contributions to the TPAC Web Page. Further she deferred to the written report submitted.

**Readiness Committee:** CDR Drinkard asked all officers to get on the OFRD List-serve to receive information on deployments and any updates to readiness issues. The planning the BMI and Healthy Lifestyles booth at the COA 2005 is in final stages. Volunteers are needed to man the booth which will be open during the same time as the exhibits hall. The North Carolina COA Chapter has donated a Heart Rate Monitor which will be raffled off at the booth.

**Professional Development Committee:** CDR Manrique thanked the subcommittee that prepared the Career Pathways document submitted to the TPAC for review. Many good ideas have been received. The recommendations will be collated and added to the document. It will then be sent out again for the TPAC review.

Awards nominations deadline is March 31, 2005 for this year's awards. Please submit nominations to CDR Nancy Balash.

Billet classification for GS equivalency is being redone by OPM in 2006 to make it more uniform across agencies. CAPT McGarvey informed that the old system of Title V and Title XXXII is being replaced with the Title XXXXII pay banding. (NIH URL is attached

**Strategic Growth Committee:** LCDR Melanson deferred to the report submitted. He introduced CDR Stephen Blackwell, recruitment specialist in the recruitment office of OCCO to talk bout the Associate Recruiter Program. CDR Blackwell informed that the AR Program is alive and well. There will be list of events shared that will help the recruitment/visibility efforts which will be supported. Some travel funding is also available to travel to the recruiting events on case by case basis. LCDR Corey Dahl is working with CAPT Siegel to place AR program as well up to date listing of vacancies on the web-site.

#### VI. OLD BUSINESS

TPAC Web Page: CAPT Siegel informed that the newly designed web-page is now on up. She thanked all the committee chairs for their contributions and also some of the committee members who provided her with material. She continues to receive comments and requests for modifications. She will continue to enhance the web-page with time. CDR Gaustad thanked CAPT Siegel for her valuable contributions.

Elections and 2005 COA: Already presented in the committee report.

Career Pathways Guide: Already presented in the committee report.

#### **VII. NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Commissioning Appointment Standards have been forwarded to each PAC for input and recommendations. CDR Gaustad asked for a task force to be formed for this function. Volunteers are: Task Force Leader: CAPT Cavanaugh, Members: CDR Payne, CDR Shapiro and LCDR Dahl
- 2. Awards Guidelines: Junior and Senior Clinician of the Year Awards are open to both Civil Service and Commissioned Corps Therapists. Awards Subcommittee needs to look at the current process evaluate and put together a guide to go with the process. The task force should also recommend modifications if any. CDR Gaustad recommended that CAPT Johnson be asked to be on this Task Force to provide guidance as she had done in the past with Joseph Hoag award. Leader: CDR Balash, Members: CAPT Johnson, CAPT Siegel and LCDR Magel.
- 3. CCMIS Web Site: That office is currently only 20% staffed hence website is not being updated regularly. A Task Force under information management committee is formed to review CCMIS web page and update the Therapist Category information with emphasis on the policy documents. Leader: LCDR Newman, Members: LCDR Faz, LCDR Roe, LCDR Woodard and LT Souvignier.
- 4. Charter/Policies and Procedure Manual Update: The TPAC Charter was last update in May 2003. It needs to be reviewed and updated. Subcommittee Leader: CDR Payne, Members: CDR Shapiro, CDR Whitehurst-Leif, CDR Figueroa and LCDR Cowher
- 5. Therapist Civ. Svc Participation in PAC: Tabled for next TPAC Meeting
- 6. Therapist Mission & Vision Statement: A task force is need to review and analyze current mission statement and update to support the new USPHS mission statement and to develop a vision statement. Leader: CDR Gaustad, Members: CDR Balash, CDR Shelton, LCDR Grogan and LCDR West.
