REVIEW AND ADOPTION OF AGENDA: II.

The agenda was reviewed and adopted with a motion by CDR Shapiro and seconded by CDR Balash

III. REVIEW AND ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS TPAC MINUTES:

February 2006 meeting minutes were provided and approved via e-mail to all TPAC members. Minutes were posted to TPAC Web site in March 2006. CDR Shapiro moved to adopt the February 2006 meeting minutes; seconded by LCDR Randall.

IV. GUEST SPEAKER(S): RADM John Babb, Director, OFRD

- The current Therapist Category readiness level is 72.7%. Officers are advised to complete readiness requirements. OCCO assesses an officer's readiness prior to promotion boards.
- The Crisis Response Service Award and Outstanding Unit Citation will be awarded to all officers who deployed to the hurricane relief efforts. The Outstanding Unit Citation is a very high level award so additional individual awards will be limited. Only 23 out of 2750 officers deployed have been approved for individual awards.
- A letter describing the new deployment role and response teams will be sent to all
 officers today. The Corps will develop four "tiers" of response with different expectations.
 Tier One will involve five Rapid Deployment Force teams and ten Secretary's Emergency
 Response Teams. Individuals assigned to Tier One will be expected to report to a point
 of departure within 12 hours of notification.
- Tier Two will involve five Applied Public Health Teams and five Mental Health Teams. Those not on Tier One or Tier Two will be placed on Tier Three which will include every other active duty officer in the Commissioned Corps. Tier Two will be expected to report to a point of departure within 36 hours and Tier Three will be expected to report to a point of departure within 72 hours of notification.
- All active duty officers in the Corps will be placed in one of these three response tiers. All officers will be assigned to a rotating schedule of months such that one-fifth of the Corps will be on call every fifth month. The current rosters will no longer be valid as of July 1, 2006. Once determined, it is essential that all officers inform their supervisors of their rotation schedule so that scheduling, work assignments, and leave requests can be considered, thus avoiding potential conflicts for the Agency, the officer, and the response mission.
- The Secretary has indicated that some officers shall be designated as "mission critical" by their agencies, and as such would only be asked to deploy in extreme circumstances.
- Tier Four will involve officers in the Inactive Reserve Corps.
- ALL OFFICERS should go to the OFRD website and complete the questionnaire by MAY 8, 2006.
- There is room on the SERT and Tier Two for roles outside therapy.
- HHS wants everything complete by June 1, 2006.
- Q & A: CDR Newman asked if Agency and supervisor approval is still required. RADM Babb reported an officer's supervisor will still need to concur. Before officers are placed on Tier One or Two teams, supervisory concurrence will be obtained by OFRD. CDR Gaustad asked if there will be more involvement in deployments with five month rotations. RADM Babb stated the Secretary will move resources sooner as a result. CDR Shapiro asked how frequent training will be for the teams and if online training courses will change. RADM Babb reported Tier One teams will train two weeks per year, Tier Two teams will train one week per year, but ultimately training will be up determined by the team leader. Readiness courses may change but there will also be new courses added to current requirements.

V. REPORTS

A. CPO Report

CAPT McGarvey stated the CBO Board meeting with the ASH was postponed. It will meet during the COA conference in Denver. The board is preparing a packet of information about the CPOs, categories, and recent issues.

- Each Agency was asked for comments on the transformation work group proposals. A major announcement on transformation may occur during the COA meeting.
- RADM Babb will announce a plan to have officers sign up with a deployment role and tier. A letter will be sent soon with a web link to a questionnaire.
- The OCCO web site will soon be consolidated and offer an individual profile for each officer. OCCO has requested that all categories have a link within the new web page.

- Representatives from contractors involved in the Commissioned Corps public relations effort presented to the CPOs.
- The White House report on Hurricane Katrina mentioned the USPHS Commissioned Corps. It proposes legislation to allow the Surgeon General to be in charge of health response during natural disasters. http://www.whitehouse.gov/reports/katrina-lessons-learned/appendix-a.html

B. <u>TPAC Chair Report</u>

CDR Gaustad thanked LCDR Grogan for her efforts planning the category day. He also thanked CDR Shelton for updating the category profile. Please review and provide feedback to CDR Shelton as necessary. CDR Gaustad asked that the information be updated twice a year – next in October 2006.

- The manual circular 382 details the new Associate Recruiter Program policy. Please review the policy on the CCMIS web site and contact the category leads if interested in becoming an associate recruiter.
- The 2005 Assimilation Board has met and recommendations have been sent to Congress. The 2006 board met in February.
- The USPHS web site has been updated with new changes from the category. Please review at your convenience.
- The Agencies are reviewing transformation proposals. More information is expected at the COA meeting.
- The USPHS operational coin will be on sale at the COA conference.
- USUHS has no online courses yet.
- CDR Gaustad recognized the 2006 Therapist Category Award recipients: CAPT Karen Siegel, Josef Hoog Award; CAPT Bonnie Thornton (Ret.), Therapist of the Year; LCDR Jeff Lawrence, Junior Officer of the Year.

- **C.** Administration Committee: LCDR Dahl reported the TPAC election has been completed. CDR Gaustad will announce the elected members.
- **D. Information Management Committee:** LCDR Newman deferred to her report but stated the Category Historian, CDR Whitehurst-Lief, needs pictures of therapists working. There are billets in Tuba City, AZ and Sitka, AK which may present opportunities for inactive reserve officers. Please contact LT Alicia Souvignier for details. **Field Rep Coordinator:** CDR Figueroa reported LT Ayanna Hill is the new field representative for the multi-agency area. Please continue to submit accomplishments from the field to the field reps. CDR Figueroa highlighted CDR Balash and LT Killman who have recently completed the requirements for their DPT. CDR West was recently detailed to the DHHS and is working in the capacity of as an action officer for one of the 4 groups reviewing recommendations for the DHHS following the Hurricane Katrina response. CDR Figueroa stated it may be beneficial to publish the quad-service physical therapist meeting minutes on the TPAC web site. CDR Gaustad agreed and stated she could contact CDR Newman to initiate this effort. She may also wish to include the quad-service OT meeting minutes as well when they meet. The full report is contained in the Information Management Committee report.
- **E. Readiness Committee:** CDR Shapiro reported the Therapist Category readiness currently stands at 72%. Thirty-four Therapist Category officers are not basic qualified. She asked officers to log on to the OFRD web page, check your status, and update if necessary.
- **F. Strategic Growth Committee:** LCDR Boles deferred to his report but stated the latest therapist openings have been published on the web site and report. He noted three new billets in the BOP at care level three institutions at Tucson, AZ, Terre Haute, IN, and Terminal Island, CA.

Please contact CDR Jean Bradley, Chief Therapist BOP, for details. LT Alicia Souvignier has officially assumed the AR Lead responsibilities from LCDR Dahl. There are 15 applicants for the Commissioned Corps in various stages of the process. He stated the Retention Subcommittee chair is vacant and the COSTEP Subcommittee reported BOP Senior COSTEP sponsorship may increase. There are nine IHS scholarship recipients and the IHS Scholarship Subcommittee has submitted a letter with suggested changes for the program including adding an additional two therapist scholarships to help fill areas of greatest need.

- **G. Professional Development Committee:** Defer to report. LCDR O'Neill-Manrique made special note of the available seats for the US Army Joint Operational Deployment Course in May and the COL Kersey Neuromusculoskeletal Course in September. Please contact LCDR Randall for more information. There will be career counseling opportunities at the COA conference with the OCCO Career Development Officer. Four slots have been allotted to the Therapist Category. Please reply to CDR Martineau if interested. Senior officers may be asked to volunteer in order to answer questions pertaining to the Therapist Category.
- H. Therapist Category Liaison: CDR Martineau not present. No report.

VI. OLD BUSINESS

<u>TPAC Elections</u>: CDR Gaustad stated seven officers have been elected to the TPAC beginning in July 2006: CDR Rita Shapiro, LCDR Laura Grogan, LCDR Fred Lief, LCDR Henry McMillan, LCDR Jon Schultz, LCDR Jeff Richardson, and LT Alicia Souvignier. The newly elected members should receive letters form the OSG soon. For officers not elected, please re-nominate yourselves next year.

<u>2006 COA</u>: LCDR Grogan stated she needs volunteers for booths. Please contact LT Tanzillo or Greg Mart, the dietitian contact. Photographs of officers deployed in any situation are also needed. The category day will be filled with topics such as deployments.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

Review of Current TPAC Benchmarks: CDR Gaustad reported the PAC Board met three times to review the current benchmarks and cover letter. The PAC Chair indicated the current cover letter is obsolete and required a better explanation for career pathways. There are no significant changes in precepts but there have been some redefinitions of benchmarks in order to better coordinate with career development. A draft letter will soon be sent to PAC members for review. Comments related to precepts one and four will be presented to the CPO Board followed by OCCO. CDR Gaustad asked the Professional Development Committee to review precepts two and three to make sure they are up to date. All officers should be familiar with precept five (Readiness). There is no status change with the proposed precept six ("3-H").

TPAC Charter Review and Update: CDR Payne stated the TPAC charter has been modified based on the November 2005 revised model charter. Three major changes have occurred with the category charter: 1) if a member resigns from the TPAC a replacement will be elected during the next election cycle. There are no longer alternates. 2) Officers serving in the OSG are now allowed to continue as members but must recuse themselves if conflicts of interest arise. 3) Members may use a non-member proxy under the condition the proposed proxy is sufficiently briefed before the meeting. There was also feedback from members concerning font and long-term training. As the PAC has no authority over long-term training, it will serve only to investigate and research opportunities. LCDR Dahl will forward the revised document to CAPT McGarvey for review and submission to the OSG.

Recommended Retirement Protocol: CDR Gaustad requested this become an action item for future meetings. He asked that we develop a retirement ceremony protocol for officers retiring within a certain amount of time. CDR Gaustad stated it was important to recognize officers who retire but are not recognized at the COA retirement ceremony or unable to attend.

Publishing Therapist Category Officer Research Articles on the TPAC Website: CDR Gaustad reported his desire to have an area on the website for category research and case studies. CAPT Siegel stated there may be copyright issues related to this request that need to be investigated. Rather, she mentioned the possibility of having links on the website or obtaining permission for publication. CDR Gaustad stated the category should consider this if proprietary issues can be worked out. CAPT Siegel would like the individual author to have the responsibility for obtaining permission to publish. CDR Gaustad would like the Education Subcommittee to direct this effort. It was also mentioned that retired officers' work could be included. Officers are encouraged to email LCDR Tarri Randall if interested in working on this proposal. CDR Gaustad stated CDR Whitehurst-Lief may also be able to provide assistance through her work as category historian.

<u>Transformation Task Force:</u> CDR Gaustad proposed a multifaceted approach to incorporate transformation changes into the category. He proposed an action item and consider of a task force for this idea. CDR West recommended the work proceed through the Readiness Committee. CDR Balash questioned what the task force's role would be. CDR Gaustad asked if the Information Committee should disseminate transformation information. CDR Gaustad proposed a central point of reference for new information and with the capability to brief the category as needed. CAPT McGarvey stated the PAC might want to consider a subcommittee within another current committee. LCDR Boles indicated the Strategic Planning and Development Committee could provide leadership on this proposal. CDR Gaustad made a motion to create a subcommittee. CDR Balash reminded everyone the Strategic Growth Subcommittee has transformation as one of its tasks. CDR Gaustad asked LCDR Boles and the Strategic Growth Subcommittee to develop a mechanism to process transformation information and report progress during the June meeting. LCDR Boles agreed.
