An average of 19,403 children 0–3 are served per month by the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF).

In Federal Fiscal Year 2006 the CCDF earmarked discretionary Infant/Toddler dollars = \$2,877,123

1,416 children served by 22 grantees are in Early Head Start.

45% of all child care requests to child care resource and referral programs target infant and toddler care.

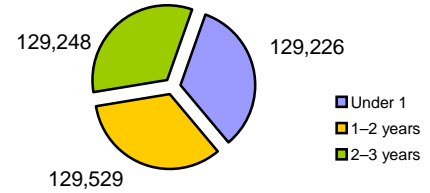

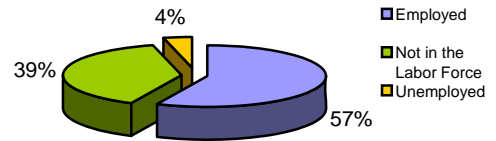

In Center-Based Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:4 for children between the ages of birth to 2.5 years; 1:8 for children between the ages of 2.5 and 3 years
(State Licensing Regulations)

In Family Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:6 (with no more than 4 under the age of 30 months, and no more than 2 of these under the age of 18 months)
(State Licensing Regulations)
