



In Licensed Center-Based Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:4 for infants through 15 months; 1:5 for 16 to 24 months; 1:8 for two-year-olds; 1:10 for three-year-olds

In Family Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:4 for infants to 15 months; 1:5 for 16 through 23 months; 1:8 for 2- to 4-year-olds
