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Characteristics of the 100 Largest Public Elementary and Secondary School Districts in the United States: 2001-02

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Highlights

The information provided in this publication was reported by state education agency officials to the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for the Common Core of Data (CCD). Data are for the 2001–02 school year. Data are reported for the student membership and staff in public schools and school districts in the United States and jurisdictions (Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Defense schools, and five outlying areas: American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands). This report includes graduate and dropout counts for the 2000–01 school year, and revenues and expenditures for fiscal year (FY) 2000.

Highlights of the report include the following:

- The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1 percent (0.6 percent) of all school districts in the United States and jurisdictions, were responsible for the education of 23 percent of all public school students (table A).
- The 100 largest districts employed 22 percent of the United States and jurisdictions' public school teachers, and contained 16 percent of all public schools and 19 percent of public high school completers (table A)
- The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district (705 students compared to 504). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher mean pupil/teacher ratio, 16.9 compared to 15.9 for the average school district (table A).
- Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for 41 percent of the 100 largest school districts (appendix C).
- The proportion of students who were minorities in the 100 largest school districts was 69 percent, compared to 41 percent in all school districts (table C).
- Among schools that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 54 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible for free and reduced-price lunch, compared to 40 percent of all students in reporting states (table C).
- In FY 2000 (the 1999–2000 school year), current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$3,404 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education to a high of \$11,503 in the Boston School District, Massachusetts (table 14).
- While the numbers of students, teachers, and schools increased between 1991–92 and 2001–02, the proportion of students, full-time equivalent teachers, and schools in the 100 largest school districts compared to the United States and jurisdictions has remained essentially unchanged (table D).

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This is the 13th and current publication in the series of reports on the largest school districts in the nation. 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Introduction

This publication provides basic descriptive information about the 100 largest school districts (ranked by student membership) in the United States and jurisdictions (Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Defense schools, and five outlying areas: American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands). When discussing characteristics, the term “United States and jurisdictions” refers to all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Defense schools, and five outlying areas. This is different from most National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) reports, which include only the 50 states and the District of Columbia in U.S. totals. Readers interested in examining data for the 50 states and District of Columbia only can refer to *Public School Student, Staff, and Graduate Counts by State: School Year 2001–02* (Young 2003) and *Overview of Public Elementary and Secondary Schools and Districts: School Year 2001–02* (Hoffman 2003).

Approximately one in four public school students in the United States and jurisdictions is served by one of the 100 largest school districts (table A). These districts are distinguished from all school districts by characteristics other than the size of their membership, such as average and median school size, number of high school graduates, number of pupils receiving special education services, and minority enrollment as a proportion of total enrollment.

Information about the characteristics listed above is found in 18 “basic tables” (tables 1–18) that accompany this report. There are also six tables (tables 19–21 and appendixes E–G) with supplemental data from the 2000 School District Tabulations (STP2) from the Bureau of the Census, which present decennial census data on household poverty, educational attainment of adults, and English language proficiency of children. For the purpose of establishing a meaningful context for the information on the 100 largest districts, four text tables (tables A–D) precede the basic tables and provide national data and data for the 100 and 500 largest school districts. Following the basic tables, appendix A lists the 500 largest school districts, with some identifying information. Appendix B is an alphabetical list of the 500 largest districts ranked by membership size. Appendix C provides a count of the number of 100 largest districts by state. Appendix D provides selected data for the 100 largest school districts in the 1991–92 school year for comparison. In all basic tables and appendixes, with the exception of appendixes B and C, districts are presented in decreasing order of membership size.

Overview of the 100 Largest Districts

In the 2001–02 school year, there were 17,140 public school districts,¹ 96,193 public schools, and 48.5 million students in public schools in the United States and jurisdictions (table A). There were over 3.1 million full-time-equivalent (FTE) teachers in the 2001–02 school year and 2.7 million high school completers in the 2000–01 school year. The 100 largest school districts comprised less than 1 percent of all public school districts but served 23 percent of all public elementary and secondary students. The 100 largest school districts contained 16 percent of public schools and employed 22 percent of FTE teachers. The 500 largest school districts comprised 3 percent of all public school districts and 32 percent of public schools; they served 43 percent (20.9 million) of all public elementary and secondary students in the United States and jurisdictions.

The 100 largest school districts ranged in size from 44,859 to 1,049,831 students in 2001–02 (table 1). Twenty-six of the 100 largest districts served over 100,000 students. The largest public school district was New York City Public Schools, New York, with 1,049,831 students enrolled in 1,218 schools. Following the New York City Public Schools district was the Los Angeles Unified district, California, with 735,058 students in 663 schools. The enrollment of each of these two largest districts was greater than enrollment for 27 states and the District of Columbia, each of the five outlying areas, the Bureau of Indian Affairs schools, and the Department of Defense schools.²

Where Were the 100 Largest School Districts?

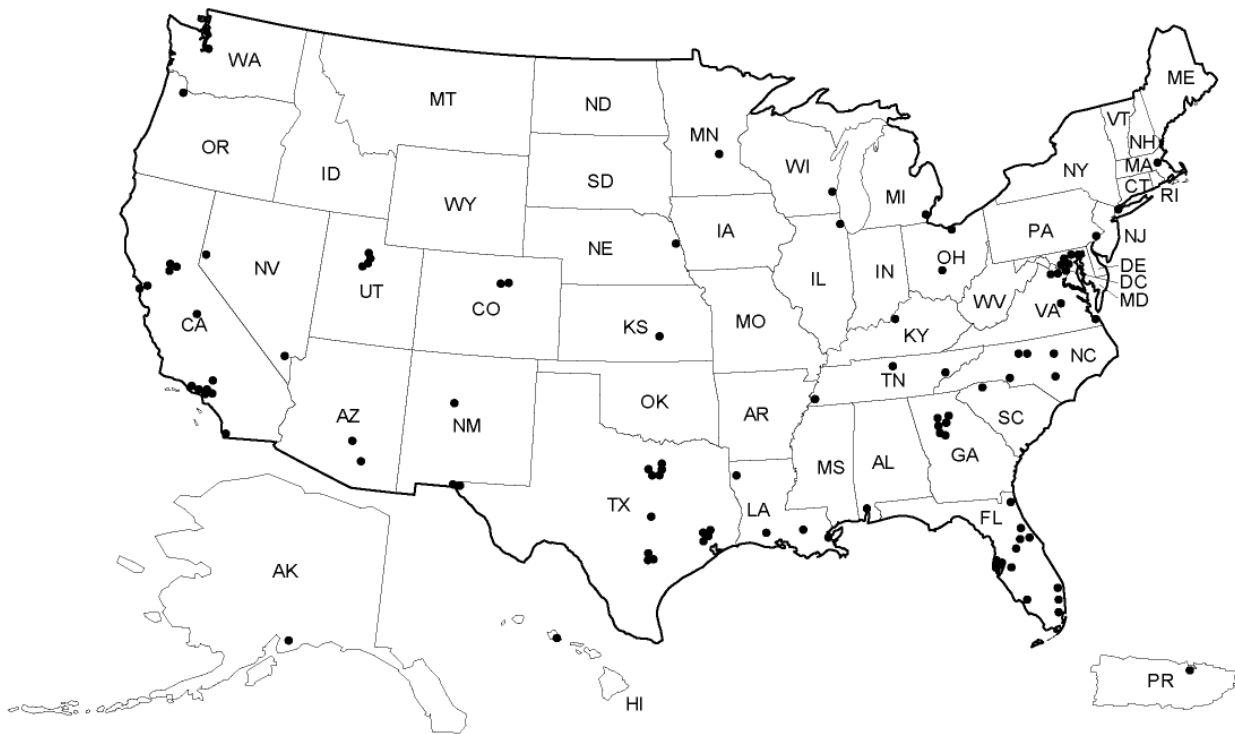
There were 33 states and jurisdictions that had at least one of the 100 largest school districts (table 1, figure 1, and appendix C) in the 2001–02 school year. Texas had 15 districts among the 100 largest, and California and Florida had 13 each. Several other states had more than one district represented in the 100 largest: Georgia and Maryland each had 6; North Carolina had 5; Louisiana, Utah, and Virginia each had 4; Tennessee had 3; and Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, and Ohio each had 2. The following states each had one school district among the 100 largest: Alabama, Alaska, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Washington, and Wisconsin. (The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico have only one school district each for their entire jurisdiction.)

The 100 largest school districts tended to be in cities and counties with large populations, with administrative offices typically located in large cities and their environs. Many of the districts were in states where the school districts have the same boundaries as counties. However, caution should be used when interpreting the areas that these school districts cover. School district boundaries are not necessarily the same as county, city, or town boundaries. Finally, 73 percent of these districts were located in coastal and gulf coast states (see appendix C for the number of the 100 largest districts by state).

¹In this report, the terms “public school districts,” “school districts,” and “regular schools districts” are used. “Public school districts,” also known as “school districts,” include regular school districts; local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, and data processing services; state and federally operated school districts; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings (e.g., charter schools reported as “placeholder” agencies). A “regular school district” is an agency responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within its jurisdiction, and is a subset of the category “public school districts/school districts.”

How Did These Districts Compare With the Average School District?

General Characteristics

In the 2001–02 school year, each of the 100 largest school districts had at least 44,000 students, whereas 73 percent of regular school districts had fewer than 2,500 students (tables B and 1). Although 13 percent of regular school districts had 5,000 or more students, 68 percent of all students were served by these districts (table B).

The average school district in the United States and jurisdictions had 5.6 schools; in comparison, the 100 largest school districts averaged 158.4 schools per district (derived from table A). Two of the three largest districts, New York City Public Schools, New York and the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico, each had over 1,200 schools (table 1). The 100 largest school districts, on average, served more students (111,686 vs. 2,831) and employed more teachers (6,622 vs. 178) than the average school district in the United States and jurisdictions (derived from table A).

School Characteristics

The 100 largest school districts had more students per school than the average school district, 705 compared with 504 students (table A). Eleven of the 100 largest school districts had an average regular school³ size of over 1,000 students (table 2). In addition to larger average school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher median⁴ pupil/teacher ratio, 16.9 to 1 compared with 15.9 to 1 for the average school district (table A). Among the 100 largest public school districts, Jefferson County, Kentucky, had the largest median pupil/teacher ratio at 27.6 to 1 and Forsyth County Schools, North Carolina, had the smallest at 12.7 to 1 (table 3).

High school completers. The number of high school completers (diploma recipients and other high school completers) as a percentage of all students was lower in the 100 largest school districts than in the average school district (table A).

School staff. At the national level, 51 percent of staff were teachers⁵ and in the 100 largest districts, 52 percent of staff were teachers. Sixty-two districts reported that 50 percent or more of their staff were teachers, 5 districts had over 60 percent teachers, and 2 districts had less than 40 percent. In 3 of the 100 largest school districts (Clark County School District, Nevada, San Francisco Unified, California, and Alpine School District, Utah), 60 percent or more of all staff were teachers. (This does not include the City of Chicago, Illinois or Greenville County, South Carolina school districts, where nonteaching staff categories may be underrepresented due to nonresponse for these categories.) Twenty-five percent of the 100 largest school districts had 1 percent or more of their staff assigned to district administration (table 4).

³A regular school is a public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education.

Title I participation. Ninety-five of the 100 largest school districts reported data for Title I eligible schools and programs for the 2001–02 school year. The percentage of Title I eligible schools in the 95 districts ranged from 10.9 percent in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg, North Carolina, district to 98.9 percent in the Philadelphia City School District, Pennsylvania. Of the 95 of the 100 largest districts that reported Title I data, an average of 51 percent of students attended a Title I eligible school (table 5). In contrast, 47 percent of all students, nationally, attended a Title I eligible school.⁶ In the 95 of the 100 largest school districts with Title I data, the percentages of students in Title I eligible schools ranged from 6.7 percent in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg, North Carolina, district to 99.9 percent in the Aldine Independent School District, Texas.

Charter schools. There were 422 charter schools administered by the 100 largest school districts in the 2001–02 school year. A little over 1 percent of students in the 100 largest school districts attended one of these 422 charter schools. There were 2,348 charter schools attended by 3 percent of students in the 50 states and District of Columbia in 2001–02.⁷ The largest number of charter schools (83) was in the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico, up from 36 charter schools in 2000–01⁸ (table 6).

Student Body

The 100 largest school districts were not homogeneous, and certain student characteristics, such as race/ethnicity, poverty level, and disability status, varied across the districts.

Race/ethnicity. American Indians/Alaska Natives, Asians/Pacific Islanders, Hispanics, and Black, non-Hispanics make up the groups other than White, non-Hispanic when assessing race at the national level. In some of the 100 largest districts, these four groups comprise the majority of student membership. The 100 largest school districts, with 23 percent of the United States and jurisdictions' public school students, served 38 percent of the 19.6 million public school students other than White, non-Hispanic (derived partially from tables A, C, and other sources, see footnote).⁹

In the 100 largest school districts, 69 percent of students were groups other than White, non-Hispanic compared with 41 percent of students in all school districts (table C).¹⁰ More than one-third (37) of the 97 districts where groups other than White, non-Hispanic membership was available had over 75 percent other than White, non-Hispanic membership, and 8 of the 10 largest school districts had a other than White, non-Hispanic student membership percentage of this size (table 7).

Even with the relatively high other than White, non-Hispanic membership in the 100 largest school districts, 36 of the 97 districts reported 50 percent or more of their students as White, non-Hispanic (table 8). Of these 36 districts, 6 reported other than White, non-Hispanic membership of less than 25 percent of their student body (table 7). In 16 of the 100 largest districts, half or more of the membership is Black, non-Hispanic. Sixteen districts report that the majority of students were Hispanic; 4 of these are among the 10 largest districts. In Hawaii, a one-district state, and the San Francisco Unified District, California, the majority of students were Asian/Pacific Islander (table 8).

Data from the 2000 Decennial Census are presented in tables 9 and 10. These data provide racial and ethnic breakouts of the population less than 18 years old residing within the school district boundaries for the 100 largest school districts. These data are presented in this report for comparison purposes; see the descriptions under Basic Tables heading for more detailed information.

Free and reduced-price lunch participation. The 100 largest school districts had a disproportionate percentage of students eligible for the free and reduced-price lunch program relative to all public school districts. Among schools that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 54 percent of students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible, compared with 40 percent of students in all districts (table C). Among the 95 of the 100 largest school districts that reported data on free and reduced-price lunch, 42 districts reported over 50 percent of their students eligible for the free and reduced-price lunch program (table 8).

Students with disabilities. Approximately 1.4 million students had individualized education programs (IEPs) in the 100 largest school districts. They made up 13 percent of all students in these districts, the same as the percentage as for the United States and jurisdictions.¹¹ These 1.4 million students comprised 22 percent of the 6.3 million students in the 50 states and District of Columbia that had IEPs. In the largest school district, New York City Public Schools, New York, 14 percent, or 146,328 students, had IEPs (table 11). About 2 percent of the schools in the 100 largest school districts were special education schools (derived from table 12).

High school dropouts. In the 1999–2000 school year, 60 of the 100 largest school districts were in states that could report dropouts using the NCES definition of dropouts (see the Methodology section for more information). The 9th- through 12th-grade dropout rate in those 60 districts ranged from less than 1 to 26 percent. Thirty-seven of the districts of the 60 that had dropout data had a 9th- through 12th-grade dropout rate between 3 and 10 percent while 14 were higher and 9 were lower (table 13).

Revenues and Expenditures for Fiscal Year 2000

In the 1999–2000 school year (FY 2000), \$373 billion were collected for public elementary and secondary education in the United States and jurisdictions; 23 percent (\$85 billion) of this revenue was collected by the 100 largest school districts.¹² Of the \$85 billion in revenue to the 100 largest school districts, 30 percent (\$25 billion) was received by the 5 largest school districts (New York City Public Schools, New York; Los Angeles Unified, California; Puerto Rico, Puerto Rico; City of Chicago School District, Illinois; and Dade County School District, Florida) (table 14). The revenues from the federal government received by the 100 largest school districts comprised between 2 percent (Plano Independent School District, Texas) and 28 percent (Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico) of all revenues to the district (table 15).

The 100 largest school districts spent \$72 billion (22 percent) of the \$324 billion in current expenditures spent in the United States and jurisdictions in 1999–2000.¹³ The two largest school districts, New York City Public Schools, New York and Los Angeles Unified, California, spent a little more than 1 out of every 5 of the current expenditure dollars expended by the 100 largest school districts (table 14). The percentage of total current expenditures spent on instruction ranged from 41 percent (District of Columbia Public Schools, District of Columbia) to 74 percent (New York City Public Schools, New York) in the 100 largest school districts (table 15).

The current expenditures per pupil were \$6,911 in the United States and jurisdictions,¹⁴ higher than the \$6,606 in the 100 largest school districts. Of the 100 largest school districts, 11 spent more than \$8,000 per pupil (with the Boston School District, Massachusetts, spending \$11,503 per pupil) and 6 spent less than \$5,000 per pupil (with the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico, spending \$3,404 per pupil) (table 14). (See the Methodology section for a definition of specific revenues and expenditures.)

Changes in the 100 Largest School Districts Between 1991 and 2001

While there has been a lot of movement within the 100 largest school districts over time, between the 1991–92 and 2001–02 school years, the 100 largest school districts remained very similar. Only 11 of the 100 largest school districts in 1991–92 were not among the 100 largest school districts by 2001–02 (see appendix D for a list of the 100 largest school districts in 1991–92).¹⁵

The number of students in the 100 largest school districts increased by 14 percent between 1991–92 and 2001–02, the number of teachers increased by 27 percent, and the number of schools increased by 11 percent. However, while the numbers of students, teachers, and schools in the 100 largest school districts increased between these years, the proportion of the national total these numbers represent was essentially unchanged. For example, the number of students in the 100 largest school districts was 23 percent of all districts in both 1991–92 and 2001–02 (table D).

Household and Population Characteristics of the 100 Largest School Districts

Household poverty. The percentages of households living in poverty varied widely among the 100 largest school districts. In 1999, the percentages of all households with incomes below the poverty line ranged from about 4 to 47 percent in the 100 largest school districts. The Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico had the largest percentage of households in poverty—47 percent.

The percentages of family households with incomes below the poverty line in the 100 largest school districts ranged from 3 to 45 percent, with the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico again having the largest percentage of family households with incomes below the poverty line (table 16).

Educational attainment. In 2000, the percentage of adults ages 25 and older with less than a high school diploma¹⁶ in the 100 largest school districts ranged from 7 to 59 percent. The percentage of adults ages 25 and older with a high school education only ranged from 12 to 37 percent. The percentage of adults with some college or higher¹⁷ ranged from 32 to 78 percent in the 100 largest school districts (derived from table 20). When looking at the upper end of education attainment (a Master's degree or higher), the percentages of adults in the 100 largest school districts ranged from 3 to 28 percent, with Montgomery County Public Schools, Maryland having the highest percentage of adults ages 25 and older with a Master's degree or higher (table 17).

English language proficiency. The percentages of children ages 5–17 who spoke English and no other language ranged from 13 percent (Santa Ana Unified, California) to 97 percent (Knox County School District, Tennessee) in the 100 largest school districts in 2000. The Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico and Santa Ana Unified, California had the lowest percentages of children ages 5–17 who spoke English and no other language in the 100 largest school districts. Looking at English language proficiency, 51 percent of children ages 5–17 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico, did not speak English at all. Among other of the 100 largest school districts, the percentage of children who spoke no English at all was 2 percent or higher in the following districts: Los Angeles Unified, California; Houston Independent School District, Texas; Dallas Independent School District, Texas; Austin ISD, Texas; Denver County, Colorado; and Santa Ana Unified, California (table 18).

Basic Tables

Table 1 presents basic data on the number of students receiving educational services; full-time equivalent (FTE) teachers; 2000–01 completers; and number of schools for each of the 100 largest school districts. Also shown is information to fully identify each school district by its city, state, and county, since the name of the district is not always sufficient for this purpose. On this and all of the other tables, the districts are shown in descending order of size (students in membership as of October 2001). Since the districts are displayed by the number of students, it is easy to note differences in the numbers of teachers, high school completers, and schools as they related to districts of similar size. For example, the Fairfax County Public Schools, Virginia, have more high school completers than all seven of the districts immediately larger than it is.

For all school districts other than Massachusetts and Tennessee school districts, the teacher count was derived from the school universe survey. Teacher counts were taken from the local education agency survey for Massachusetts and Tennessee because teacher data were not reported at the school level. (For a more detailed description of the surveys see the methodology section.)

NOTE: In tables 2,3,7,8,19,and 21, only schools with student membership (or regular schools with students, as specified in table 4) are used.

Table 2 provides information on school characteristics in the 100 largest school districts by displaying students (students in membership) at different percentile levels, as well as mean school size for each district (computed using regular schools having membership). For example, in New York City Public Schools, New York, the table shows that the smallest 25 percent of schools have student memberships of 513 or fewer, while the largest 25 percent have student memberships of 1,098 or more. Dividing all the students in regular schools in the district by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 896.5 students. If all the regular schools in New York City Public Schools were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 739 pupils in membership.

The average school size ranges from a low of 395.1 pupils (Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico) to a high of 1,374.4 (Gwinnett County School District, Georgia) for these districts. The largest school in 100 largest districts, and also the largest regular school in the United States, is the 5,491-student Charles W. Flanagan High School, Broward County School District, Florida.¹⁸

Table 3 presents median pupil/teacher ratios for the schools found in the categories established in table 5. Since teacher counts by school were not available for the states of Massachusetts and Tennessee, no pupil/teacher ratio could be calculated for the districts in these states. Among the districts for which data were available, the median pupil/teacher ratio for all schools in a district was 16.9. The pupil/teacher ratios varied from 12.7 in Forsyth County Schools, North Carolina, to 27.6 in Jefferson County, Kentucky.

Table 4 presents the different types of staff in each district. Teachers represented the largest proportion of staff. Sixty-two districts reported that 50 percent or more of their staff were teachers and 5 districts had over 60 percent teachers.

Table 5 reports the number and percentage of Title I eligible schools, the percentage of students in Title I eligible schools, and the percentage of students in Title I school-wide programs. The 2001–02 school year was the fourth year the CCD collected this information. Not all states were able to report this information. The percentage of Title I eligible schools in districts that provided the information varied widely, from 11 to 99 percent. Of the 95 districts that reported at least one Title I school, 29 reported that 100 percent of Title I schools were also Title I school-wide eligible.¹⁹

The number of Title I eligible schools in a district were compared against the number of Title I school-wide programs within the district to determine whether all Title I eligible schools were also Title I school-wide eligible. If the number of Title I eligible schools in a district was equal to the number of Title I school-wide programs, then that district was counted as having all Title I schools as Title I school-wide eligible.

Table 6 also reports new data items beginning in the 1998–99 school year, magnet and charter schools. Only 62 of the largest 100 school districts either were able to report the number of magnet schools or reported that magnet schools did not exist in their states, while all districts in states that had charter schools reported the number of charter schools. Many charter schools function as their own school districts, which is why many of the districts in this report exist in states with charter school legislation but report no charter schools within their district.

Table 7 gives the number of schools in each district in five ranges of percent-non-white student membership, as well as the overall non-white student percentage for each district. In this reporting, non-white is defined as all race/ethnicities other than White, non-Hispanic. Eight out of the 10 largest school districts have more than 75 percent non-white student membership. The percentage of non-white students ranges from 100 percent in the Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico, to 8.2 percent in the Jordan School District, Utah.

Whereas **table 8** deals with the number of schools in each district that have at least one student whose race is other than White, non-Hispanic, table 8 presents the percentage of students in each district by specific racial/ethnic categories. This table illustrates that some school districts are made up of many non-white groups while others have high concentrations of one non-white group. For example, the New York City Public Schools, New York has 38 percent Hispanic students and 34 percent Black, non-Hispanic students whereas the Philadelphia City School District, Pennsylvania, has a much higher percentage of Black, non-Hispanic students (65 percent) than any other non-white group.

Also shown in table 8 is the percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch. Responses in this data category were available for 95 out of the 100 largest districts. Among these districts, the percentages of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch under the National School Lunch Program varied greatly. Of the 95 districts that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 42 districts reported that over 50 percent of their students were eligible for free or reduced-price lunch.

Tables 9 and 10 present data from the 2000 Decennial Census. These data represent the race/ethnicity data collected on the Census “short form.” Table 9 shows the numbers and table 10 the percent of the population under the age of 18 by race and ethnicity. The way race/ethnicity was collected on the Decennial Census is not the same as it is collected on the 2001–02 CCD. The Decennial Census presented two racial/ethnic questions to respondents, separating the Hispanic identification from the races. Respondents answered a question on their Hispanic status first, then answered a question on their race (Hispanic not included). See the *Overview of Race and Hispanic Origin: 2000* (C2KBR/01-1) for more information from the Bureau of the Census’ American Factfinder Website at: <http://factfinder.census.gov>. All NCES surveys, including the CCD, will be using these new racial and ethnic data items in the future.

Table 11 presents the numbers of students assigned to the schools in the 100 largest school districts. It should be noted that students attending a “non-regular” school (i.e., special education, vocational education, other or alternative school) are often counted at their regular home school rather than the school they attend. The number and percentage of students having Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act-Part B is also shown in table 3. The student counts presented in this table are aggregated from the school level, and may differ from counts presented elsewhere in this report that are derived from the school district level.

Table 12 presents the number of schools in the 100 largest districts, by type of school. All but three of the districts have specialized schools devoted to special, vocational, or alternative education. It can be seen from this table that districts vary widely in their use of specialized versus general schools in educating students with special needs. This table also includes schools that do not have students. Schools may not have students for a variety of reasons, the most common being that the school serves a student population that is “counted” at another school. For example, students dually enrolled in a regular school and a vocational education school would be counted in only one of these schools.

Table 13 reports the percentage of 2000–01 school year dropouts for those districts in states that were able to report dropouts using the NCES dropout definition (see Glossary for definition). Sixty of the 100 districts have data on this table.

Table 14 deals with the school district revenues and expenditures and is based on fiscal year 2000 (which is school year 1999–2000) local government financial data collected by the Governments Division of the U.S. Census Bureau. It presents the amount of revenue received by source (local, state, and federal); current expenditures and those current expenditures for instruction; and current expenditures per pupil in membership for fiscal year 2000. Data for Puerto Rico were obtained from the National Public Education Financial Survey. Among the 100 largest school districts, Boston School District, Massachusetts, had the highest expenditure per pupil (\$11,503) and Puerto Rico Department of Education, Puerto Rico the lowest (\$3,404). Overall, there were 22 school districts with per pupil expenditures greater than \$7,000 and 2 districts with per pupil expenditures less than \$4,000.

Whereas table 10 deals with the dollar amounts of revenues and expenditures, **table 15** presents the percentages of revenues by sources as well as the percentage of current expenditures spent on instruction. The 100 largest school districts spent 63 percent of their current expenditures on instruction ranging from a high of 74 percent in the New York City Public Schools, New York to a low of 41 percent in the District of Columbia Public Schools, District of Columbia.

Tables 16, 17, and 18 present data from the 2000 School District Tabulations (STP2) from the Bureau of the Census. Table 16 presents data on the percentages of all households and family households with incomes below the poverty line in the 100 largest districts. Table 17 presents data on the educational attainment of adults ages 25 and older in the 100 largest districts, and table 18 presents data on the English language proficiency of children ages 5 to 7 in the 100 largest school districts. Data from the 2000 School District Tabulations are sample data and are subject to sampling error.

In **table 19**, data are given on the number of students assigned to graded (three categories) and ungraded levels. In accounting for their students, 62 of the 100 largest districts assign all of their students to numbered grades and 38 use the “ungraded” status for some students in some settings, such as special education, vocational education, and other specialized and alternative programs. In this table, students assigned to all types of schools are counted in the grade for which they are reported. The student counts presented in this table are aggregated from the school level, and may differ from counts presented elsewhere in this report that are derived from the school district level.

A few of the new items starting in 1998–99 asked for the numbers of English Language Learners (ELL, formerly known as Limited English Proficient, LEP) and migrant students. **Table 20** reports these totals for those districts that provided this information. Ninety of the 100 largest school districts reported the number of migrant students enrolled in the previous year. Fresno Unified School District, California, reported the most migrant students served (9,076) and the highest percentage of migrant students (11.2 percent). Fresno also reported the most migrant students in summer programs, 2,304. Ninety-five of the 100 largest districts were able to report students served in ELL programs. Santa Ana Unified School District, California, reported the highest percentage of ELL students, 65 percent.

Table 21 answers the question of how many “primary,” “middle,” and “high” schools there are in the 100 largest school districts. Since nearly every conceivable grade span is found among the schools in the 100 largest districts, the following four categories are used: *primary* (low grade of prekindergarten to 3; high grade up to 8), *middle* (low grade 4 to 7; high grade 4 to 9), *high* (low grade 7 to 12; high grade 12), and *other* (all other configurations, including PK, K, or 1 to 12).

How to read this table: Using Dade County as an example, the table shows that 25 percent of the schools have a pupil membership of 573 or less, and 25 percent have a membership of 1,338 or more. If all the regular schools in Dade County were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 882 pupils in membership. Dividing all students in regular schools by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 1,095.8 students. The standard deviation is a measure of how schools in the district are distributed between the minimum and maximum compared to the mean. Smaller standard deviations indicate the schools in the district are clustered closer to the mean value while larger standard deviations indicate that school size is spread more widely across the range of possible values.

Methodology

Common Core of Data

The primary source of the nonfiscal data for this report is the 2001–02 Common Core of Data (CCD). Information was reported to NCES by state education agencies in the spring of 2002. There are three nonfiscal CCD surveys collecting basic descriptive data on public education in the nation: the school (Public School Universe Survey), local education agency (Local Education Agency Universe Survey), and state (State Nonfiscal Survey). Fiscal data are gathered at the state level by NCES in the National Public Education Financial Survey (NPEFS) and at the local level in the Annual Survey of Local Government Finances (F-33 series of the Census of Local Governments) conducted by the Governments Division of the Bureau of the Census. The most recent year for which data are available is 2000. National and Puerto Rico fiscal data were taken from the 1999–2000 NPEFS.

District-level data were provided by all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Department of Defense schools, and five outlying areas: American Samoa, Guam, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands by a state CCD Coordinator. CCD Coordinators ensure the quality of their data submission with NCES each year. If a data item is marked “Data not available” it indicates the state did not report the data item on their CCD submission.

Districts represented in this report are of various physical sizes and geographic locations. The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico are each administered as one school district. Some districts comprise a substantial portion of a state’s total student membership, while others make up only a small fraction of the state’s total student membership. The Bureau of Indian Affairs and Department of Defense schools and the outlying areas are included in the United States and jurisdiction totals in this report.

Data Quality

CCD data are reported by State Education Agencies (SEAs) for individual schools and districts within the state, as well as the summary state information. Staff at NCES and its collection agent, the Bureau of the Census, work with the SEAs to clean and edit the data. SEA State CCD Coordinators must correct or confirm any numbers that are challenged in the NCES edits. NCES accepts the state’s responses to these edit questions. In a limited number of situations, if the SEA does not provide NCES with the explanation or new data for an item, NCES will suppress or edit the data themselves. Dropout data require an additional statement indicating that the state follows the CCD dropout definition exactly.

NCES challenges SEA data based on many reasons. Some examples of edits include numbers appearing out of range when compared to national averages, previous year’s data, or internal state reports. If a response is logically impossible, for example, reporting “Title I School status” as “not applicable” when “yes” or “no” are the only possible answers, NCES will consult with the state and replace the response with a logically acceptable alternative. As another example of an edit, if a reported total is less than the sum of the detail comprising that total, the total will be changed to the sum of the detail. Missing data at the state level are imputed to support reporting national totals for the reporting year as well as using the data for projections.

Item Nonresponse

There were some items that were not available at the school district level. The following bullets describe nonresponse in the CCD school and agency universe surveys that affected the information presented in this report:

1. There are no teacher counts on the school universe survey for 2 states which account for 5 of the 100 largest school districts: Massachusetts (1), Tennessee (3), and Jefferson County School District, Kentucky (1). This impacts the median pupil/teacher ratios by school instruction level presented in table 7. Teacher counts are available for these districts on the agency universe survey so these totals appear on all other tables that present teacher counts.

2. There are no data on free and reduced-price lunch eligibility for 2 states, which account for 5 of the 100 largest school districts: Arizona (2) and Tennessee (3). This impacts the percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch presented in tale 9. On table C, there is a percentage of free and reduced-price lunch of those who reported free and reduced-price lunch for context.
3. There are no dropout data for 11 states which account for 40 of the 100 largest school districts: Arizona (2), California (11), Colorado (2), Florida (14), Hawaii (1), Kansas (1), Michigan (1), New York (2), North Carolina (4), South Carolina (1), and Washington (1). No totals for dropouts are presented in this report.

More Information on CCD Methodology

For more information on the CCD school and agency universe surveys and response rates see *Overview of Public Elementary and Secondary Schools and Districts: School Year 2001–02* (NCES 2003–411). This report discusses missing data, data quality, and presents state totals of the CCD data items from the school and agency surveys. It includes state-idiosyncratic treatment of charter and magnet schools as well as schools and districts with no student membership.

2000 Census School District Tabulation (STP2)

Data presented in tables 16–18 and appendixes E, F, and G come from the U.S. Bureau of the Census 2000 Census School District Tabulation (STP2). The STP2 contains sample data compiled from the questions asked of a sample of all people and housing units for Census 2000. Population items include basic population totals; urban and rural; households and families; marital status; grandparents as caregivers; language and ability to speak English; ancestry; place of birth, citizenship status, and year of entry; migration; place of work; journey to work (commuting); educational attainment; veteran status; disability; employment status; industry, occupation, and class of worker; income; and poverty status. Housing items include basic housing totals; urban and rural; number of rooms; number of bedrooms; year moved into unit; household size and occupants per room; units in structure; year structure built; heating fuel; telephone service; plumbing and kitchen facilities; vehicles available; value of home; monthly rent; and shelter costs. Data for these individual population and housing characteristics are organized into a series subject-matter tables.

Sample Design

The data contained in the STP2 are based on the Census 2000 sample, and are estimates of the actual figures that would have been obtained from a complete count. These estimates are subject to both sampling and nonsampling error.

Every person and housing unit in the United States was asked basic demographic and housing questions. A sample of these people and housing units was asked more detailed questions about items such as income, occupation, and housing costs. The sampling unit for Census 2000 was the housing unit, including all occupants. There were four different housing unit sampling rates: 1 in 8, 1 in 6, 1 in 4, and 1 in 2, for an overall average rate of about 1 in 6. To calculate the standard errors for STP2 data, the following were used: the unadjusted standard error for the characteristic that would result under a simple random sample design; the design factor for the characteristic estimated based on the sample design and estimation techniques employed to produce Census long form data estimates; the number of people, housing units, household, or families in the publication area; and the observed sampling rate. Definitions

Alternative Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that: (1) addresses needs of students that typically cannot be met in a regular school, (2) provides nontraditional education, (3) serves as an adjunct to a regular school, or 4) falls outside of the categories of regular, special education, or vocational education.

Bureau of Indian Affairs schools and districts—A school or district that is directly funded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of the Interior.

Charter school—A school which provides free public elementary and/or secondary education to eligible students under a specific charter granted by the state legislature or other appropriate authority, and designated by such authority to be a charter school. Charter schools can be administered by regular school districts, state education agencies, or chartering organizations. They are reported on the CCD by the type of district that administers them.

Current expenditures—Funds spent for operating local public schools and local education agencies, including such operating expenses as salaries for school personnel, student transportation, school books and materials, and energy costs, but excluding capital outlay and interest on school debt.

Dropout—Defined by the CCD as those students who were enrolled in school at some time during the previous school year; were not enrolled at the beginning of the current school year; have not graduated from high school or completed a state- or district-approved educational program; and do not meet any of the following exclusionary conditions: transfer to another public school district, private school, or state- or district-approved education program; temporary absence due to suspension or school-approved education program; or death. For a more detailed description of dropouts and dropout rates see *Public High School Dropouts and Completers From the Common Core of Data: School Years 1991–92 through 1997–98* (NCES 2002–317).

English Language Learner (ELL) students—Individuals who:

- A. were not born in the United States or whose native language is a language other than English; or
- B. come from environments where a language other than English is dominant; or
- C. are American Indians and Alaskan Natives and who come from environments where a language other than English has had a significant impact on their level of English language proficiency; and who, by reason thereof, have sufficient difficulty speaking, reading, writing, or understanding the English language, to deny such individuals the opportunity to learn successfully in classrooms where the language of instruction is English or to participate fully in our society.

Federal revenues—Include direct grants-in-aid to school or agencies, funds distributed through a state or intermediate agency, and revenues in lieu of taxes to compensate a school district for nontaxable federal institutions within a district's boundary.

Free and reduced-price lunch eligible—Number of students who are eligible for the Free and Reduced-Price Lunch Program under the National School Lunch Act. Any school that reported 100 percent eligible students is adjusted for reasons of student confidentiality. Caution should be used when interpreting these data. Four states did not report free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, and others may have included reduced price lunch students or reported participation instead of eligibility data.

Guidance counselors—Professional staff assigned specific duties and school time for counseling students and parents, addressing learning problems, evaluating student abilities, and assisting students on career and personal development.

High School Completers—Students who completed the course of public elementary and secondary education offered by the school district and who received a high school diploma, or who met other requirements of completion as defined by state law or policy during the period September 2000 through August 2001.

Individual Education Program (IEP)—As used here, refers to written instructional plan for students with disabilities designated as special education students under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA-Part B) which includes: (1) statement of present levels of educational performance of a child; (2) statement of

annual goals, including short-term instructional objectives; (3) statement of specific educational services to be provided and the extent to which the child will be able to participate in regular educational programs; (4) projected date for initiation and anticipated duration of services; and (5) appropriate objectives, criteria and evaluation procedures and schedules for determining, on at least an annual basis, whether instructional objectives are being achieved.

Instructional expenditures—Current expenditures for activities directly associated with the interaction between teachers and students. These include teacher salaries and benefits, supplies (such as textbooks), and purchased instructional services.

Instructional support staff—Includes instructional coordinators and supervisors and instructional aides.

LEA (district) administrators—Local education agency superintendents, deputy and assistant superintendents, and other persons with district-wide responsibilities such as business managers; and administrative assistants.

Library/media staff—Professional staff members who are assigned specific duties and school time for professional library and media service activities. Includes library/media specialists and support staff.

Local revenues—Include revenues from such sources as local property and nonproperty taxes, investments, and revenues from student activities, textbook sales, transportation and tuition fees, and food service revenues.

Magnet school—Regardless of the source of funding, a magnet school or program is a special school or program designed to attract students of different racial/ethnic backgrounds for the purpose of reducing, preventing, or eliminating racial isolation and/or to provide an academic or social focus on a particular theme.

Migrant students—A migrant student as defined under 34 CFR 200.40:

- A. is younger than 22 (and has not graduated from high school or does not hold a high school equivalency certificate). If the child is too young to attend school-sponsored educational programs, but is old enough to benefit from an organized instructional program; or
- B. a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher; or
- C. performs, or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who performs, qualifying agricultural or fishing employment as a principal means of livelihood; or
- D. has moved within the preceding 36 months to obtain or to accompany or join a parent, spouse, or guardian to obtain, temporary or seasonal employment in agricultural or fishing work; or
- E. has moved from one school district to another; or in a state that is comprised of a single school district, has moved from one administrative area to another within such district; or resides in a school district of more than 15,000 square miles, and migrates a distance of 20 miles or more to a temporary residence to engage in a fishing activity. (Provision E currently applies only to Alaska.)

Outlying Areas—Include: American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

Other staff—Includes support staff for local education agencies, schools, student support services and other areas such as data processing, health, transportation, etc.

Per-pupil expenditures—Current expenditures for public elementary and secondary education in a state divided by the student membership. The numbers reported here, based on membership, can be expected to be smaller than per-pupil expenditures based on average daily attendance because the membership counts are generally larger than average daily attendance.

Public school—An institution that provides educational services and has the following characteristics:

- has one or more grade groups (prekindergarten through grade 12) or is ungraded;
- has one or more teachers to give instruction;
- is located in one or more buildings or sites;

- has an assigned administrator;
- receives public funds as primary support; and
- is operated by an education agency.

Pupil/teacher ratio—The ratio of pupils to teachers in a school district, based on the total number of pupils (student membership) and the total full-time-equivalent (FTE) number of teachers reported in the schools associated with the school district. The pupil/teacher ratio is not a class size but rather a district level measure of pupils and teachers.

Pupils in membership—Count of all students whose names have been entered on the roll, minus those whose names have been withdrawn, on or before the closest school day to October 1. Membership counts at the district level may include students for whom the district is providing educational services through some other agency or institution.

Race/ethnicity of groups other than White, non-Hispanic—Includes at least one student of a minority race/ethnicity. These race/ethnicities include: American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian/Pacific Islander, Hispanic, and Black, non-Hispanic.

Regular school—A public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education. It is possible for a regular school, as it is for a vocational, special, or alternative education school, to have no students in membership.

Regular school district—Agency responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within its jurisdiction. This category excludes local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, and data processing services; state and federally operated school districts; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings.

Revenues—Additions to assets, which do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies in the state. Revenues include funds from local, intermediate, state, and federal sources.

School administrators—Staff members whose activities are concerned with directing and managing the operation of a particular school.

Schools having membership—Schools at which students are counted for administrative purposes, even though the students may attend one or more other schools for all or part of their school day.

Special Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that: (1) focuses primarily on special education, including instruction for any of the following: hard of hearing, deaf, speech-impaired, health-impaired, orthopedically impaired, mentally retarded, seriously emotionally disturbed, multi-handicapped, visually handicapped, deaf and blind; and (2) adapts curriculum, materials or instruction for students served.

State revenues—Include both direct funds from state governments and funds in lieu of taxation. Revenues in lieu of taxes are paid to compensate a school district for nontaxable state institutions or facilities within the district's boundary.

Teacher—A professional school staff member who instructs students and maintains daily student attendance records.

Title I school—A Title I school is a school designated under appropriate state and federal regulations as being high poverty and eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of Public Law 103-382.

Title I school-wide—A program in which all the students in a school are designated under appropriate state and federal regulations as eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of Public Law 103-382.

Vocational Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that focuses primarily on vocational, technical, or career education, and provides education and training in one or more semi-skilled or technical occupations.
