

### Definitions

- **No Documented Diagnosis:** Group that includes infants that are “In process,” “Died / Parents declined services,” “Non-residents or Moved out of jurisdiction,” and “Unable to contact / Unresponsive / Unknown”
- **LFU / LTD:** Loss to Follow-up / Loss to Documentation
  - Sub group of those reported in “No Documented Diagnosis.” Includes infants where families were *Unable to be contacted* or *Unresponsive* and *Unknown* cases
- **Not Confirmed to be Receiving Early Intervention (EI):** Group that includes infants that “Died / Parents declined services,” “Non-residents or Moved out of jurisdiction,” and “Unable to contact / Unresponsive / Unknown”
