Group	Employee Percent	Mission
1. Idaho National Laboratory (Battelle Energy Alliance)	55%	Research & Development Laboratory
2. Idaho Cleanup Project (CH2M-WG Idaho)	30%	Clean up legacy waste at INL Site
3. Advanced Mixed Waste Treatment Project (Bechtel BWXT)	10%	Prepare waste for shipment offsite
4. DOE Idaho Operations Office	5%	Manage contractors at INL Site



Building Electronics Stewardship Team

- Sept 2006, Kicked off the Process
 - Visit from Jeff Eagan & Jane Powers
 - Assembled audiences consisting of upper management from each group and employees that supported each of the 3 lifecycle phases:
 - Acquisition & Procurement
 - Operations & Maintenance
 - End-of-Life Management
 - Identified the enthusiastic parties & good practices already in place



Who is our Electronics Stewardship Team?

- P2 Representative from each Group
- Acquisitions & Procurement- Affirmative Procurement, Electronics Procurement Specialists
- Operations & Maintenance- IT
- End of Life Management- Property Management



The Road to Management Consensus

- Typical FEC Approach
 - Get Management Approval
 - Register
 - Gather Baseline Data
 - Write Goals
 - Review Award criteria status

- INL Site Approach:
 - Gather Baseline Data
 & Award criteria
 status
 - Write Goals
 - Get Management Approval
 - Register & Submit Award Application

How much does it cost? How much do we need to change?



Electronics Stewardship Already in Place

- Oct-Nov 2006, While gathering baseline data & award criteria status, we learned that we were eligible for an award based on some of the following good practices:
 - EPEAT equipment was purchased during FY06
 - Purchased \$25K of refurbished computers in FY06 (est. savings of \$37K)
 - Two groups had made decision to cease purchases of personal printers
 - Only LCD monitors were being purchased (no CRTs!)



Building Consensus from Management

- Dec 2006, Briefed Management on status, began process of getting upper management approval
 - Shared baseline & current award eligibility
 - Showed suggested goals & path forward
 - Four groups with unique missions
 - Some happy with status quo, some more progressive
- Jan '07, Registered as an FEC Partner
 - Submitted baseline report, goals, annual report, and award application



Challenges at INL Site

- COMMUNICATION!
 - Keep in touch throughout the year!
- Different levels of support/interest for Electronics Stewardship within each Group
- Different missions of each Group means different priorities for Electronics Stewardship activities
- Incorporating FEC metrics into what's already tracked at INL Site



Achievements at INL Site

- Learning from our challenges
- Purchasing:
 - Purchasing Energy Star and/or EPEAT electronics
- Operating:
 - Enable power management settings during computer set-up
 - Encourage employees to power down computers on nights and weekends
- Dispositioning:
 - No computers sent to landfills (Internal reuse, donating computers to schools & non-profits, public auction)



Achievements at INL Site

Awards:

- 2007 & 2008 FEC Bronze Award
- First place in the 2007 Electronics Reuse & Recycle Campaign (ERRC), Large Western Civilian division

Outreach:

- Booth at Idaho Falls Earth Day Celebration
- Presentation at Idaho Energy & Green Building Conference



Lessons Learned

- Stay in communication throughout the year, not just at reporting time
- Do homework ahead of time
 - Anticipate management's concerns
 - Get ready for reporting early
- Don't take anything for granted
 - What you think is insignificant, may not be considered as such by the powers that be



Next Steps/ What could be improved upon?

- Education campaign for employees:
 - Duplex printing awareness
 - Power-down computers
 - Promote FEC Partnership
- Monitor progress throughout the year during periodic meetings of FEC Team
 - Keep everyone updated & involved
 - Track progress of goals
 - Tailor metrics that procurement and property management track for ease of annual reporting
