NOTE.—The wagon and mail messenger routes noted in the above statement of service are included at this time as confirming the practice that has been in operation for a number of years.

During the contract term the location of the Pennsylvania Railroad Depot will probably be changed to the new terminal at Thirty-first street and Seventh avenue, and the general post-office may be located at Thirty-third street and Eighth avenue. Station H will probably be located at Forty-fifth street and Lexington avenue before the commencement of the contract term.

The statement of service in the foregoing schedules shows that which it is thought will be necessary at the beginning of the contract term. It may be necessary to either increase or decrease the trips and to include service to and from other points not named in said statement. When increased trips or additional service become necessary for any reason the facts must be reported to the department by the postmaster and authorization obtained from the Second Assistant Postmaster-General before the same can be put into operation, except where additional trips become necessary in an emergency, when the postmaster may require the same of the contractor for such time as may be necessary, not exceeding five days. The postmaster should immediately report such emergency service to the department. When decreases may be made the postmaster should report the facts to the department and an order will be issued by the Second Assistant Postmaster-General decreasing the service accordingly. For any authorized change in the service other than emergency service the rate per mile of travel, as shown by the annual rate of the proposal of the accepted bidder and the annual miles of travel based on the frequency and distances shown in the above statement of service. So much of the "Instructions to Bidders" as is inconsistent with the foregoing shall not apply to the contract for service on this route.

If necessary the contractor will be required to carry on each of the wagons in service side lights of suitable size and design and placed in such manner as will show a light from the front, side, and rear of each wagon. He will be required to place a small United States mail sign on the front of the wagon over the driver's seat, equip the wagons with suitable gongs, and provide storm curtains for the protection of the drivers and postal employees riding on the seat of the wagon. The serial number of the wagon must also be placed over the rear doors in addition to the requirements of the specifications in this respect. The drivers employed by the contractor on this route must be citizens of the United States, of suitable character, etc., as specifically required in section 38 of the "Instructions to Bidders," and must be not less than 21 years of age.

In addition to the locks called for in the specifications for regulation wagons, the contractor will be required to place on the rear doors of the wagons for use on this route, in a suitable position and manner, padlock keepers in order that the department may fasten the wagon, if desired, with the United States mail lock. This to be in addition to the locks and safety devices called for under the contract. The key for the United States mail lock will be retained in the custody of postal officials.

The distances shown represent approximately the length of trip to the point of receipt and delivery of mails in the several railroad stations, or to the Railway Mail Service transfer clerk's office.

These distances are liable to vary with the train arrangements and the handling of mail in the different railroad stations. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

1. The foregoing schedules on some routes show approximately the service as performed during the week named in the statement of service; on other routes the service shown is that which it is believed will probably be required of the contractor at the beginning of the contract term. Bidders, however, must personally inform themselves of the amount and character of the service that will be required during the contract term, beginning with July 1, 1909. Bidders and their sureties are warned that they should familiarize themselves with the terms of the contract, schedules of service, and instructions contained herein before they shall assume any liabilities as such bidders or sureties, to prevent misapprehension or cause of complaint thereafter.

2. All persons are cautioned not to allow their names to be used as bidders unless they intend to personally perform or supervise the service. Every bidder is required to make oath that the bid is made in *good faith* and with the intention to enter into contract to perform service in case said bid shall be accepted. A person subscribing to such oath, but not intending to enter into the business of carrying the mail, either in person or by an employee, is guilty of perjury and is subject to the penalties prescribed for such offense.

3. No proposal submitted under this advertisement will be considered unless the person making the proposal shall agree in his proposal that in the event of the service being awarded to him he will give his personal supervision to the performance of the same and will reside on or contiguous to the route. The words "on or contiguous to the route" as used in this section are to be construed as meaning within the territory regularly served by a post-office on the route.

4. A contractor who shall fail to give his personal supervision to the performance of his service, or to reside on or contiguous to his route, may expect to be declared a failing contractor and that the service will be relet and he and his sureties held liable for any damage that may be suffered thereby.

5. The terms mail-messenger service, transfer service, and mail-station service, as used in this advertisement, are intended to be understood as follows:

Mail-messenger service is the service between post-offices; between a post-office and a railroad station; between a post-office and a steamboat landing; between a post-office and an electric or cable car.

Transfer service is the service between two railroad stations; between a railroad station and a steamboat landing; between a railroad station and an electric or cable car; between two electric or cable cars; between an electric or cable car and a steamboat landing; between two steamboat landings.

Mail-station service is the service to or from a mail station of a post-office.

6. The contractor for any route under this advertisement will be required to perform, without additional compensation, any and all additional service that may be necessary from July 1, 1909, or at any time thereafter during the contract term, between post-offices, between the post-office and railroad stations, between the post-office and steamboat landings, between the post-office and mail-stations, between the post-office and the points of exchange with electric or cable cars, and between the several post-offices, railroad stations, steamboat landings, mail stations, or points of exchange with electric or cable cars NAMED IN THE SCHEDULE OF SERVICE FOR SUCH ROUTE IN THIS ADVERTISEMENT.

7. He will also be required to perform, without additional compensation, any and all additional service during the contract term that may be caused by changes of site of the said post-offices, railroad stations, steamboat landings, mail stations, or points of exchange with electric or cable cars and to and from any new railroad station within the city used by a company named in the schedule of service, and also such mail-messenger service as may be necessary between the post-office and a new railroad using the depot of a railroad named in the schedule of service, and such transfer and mail-station service as may be necessary to and from such railroad; provided that in the case of the change of site of a mail station the increase in distance traveled by reason of such change of site does not exceed one-quarter of a mile per trip each way. The discontinuance of a mail station and the establishment of another in its stead, not involving an increase in travel of more than one-quarter of a mile each way per trip, will be regarded as a change of site, and no additional pay will be allowed for the increased service caused by such change.

8. Some of the trips shown in the schedule of service on the routes under this advertisement require the use of several wagons.

9. The term "trip," as used in this advertisement, is understood to cover all of the mail to go at one time from a point named in the schedule of service for any route to some other point on said route whether one or more wagons are necessary to transport the mail. Where several "dispatches" are made at the same time and can be carried in the same wagon without detriment to the mail service, the consolidated dispatches so carried may be considered a "trip."

10. There should be but one route bid for in a proposal. Consolidated or combination bids (proposing one sum for two or more routes) can not be considered.

11. The numbers given to the various mail routes in this advertisement may not correspond with the numbers of the routes now in operation covering corresponding service. It is *very important*, therefore, that postmasters and others should use *the numbers herein given* when referring to service under this advertisement, and should use the *old numbers* when referring to the service for which contracts will expire June 30, 1909.

12. Proposals must name the amount per annum for the whole of service and not by the trip.

13. The statements of probable additional service that may be necessary on the routes under this advertisement are given so that bidders may be as fully advised as possible of the amount of service likely to be required. Such statements will not, however, limit the liability of the contractors to perform, *without additional compensation*, all service of the kind indicated in sections 6 and 7 that may become necessary.

14. The distances given are believed to be substantially correct, but no additional pay will be allowed should they be greater than herein stated. Bidders must personally inform themselves as to the distances, the running time, the weight of the mails, the condition of hills, streets, toll bridges, ferries, and obstructions of all kinds whereby expense may be incurred, and as to the *probable increase, additional service, or changes likely to be made* prior to the ending of the contract term. Claims for additional pay, based on such grounds, or for alleged mistakes or misapprehensions as to the service required, or for bridges destroyed or ferries discontinued, can not be considered.

15. Following the statement of service under each route in this advertisement is noted for the information of the public the rate paid for screen-wagon or mail-messenger service under existing contracts or designations, *but the existing contract or designation may not cover all of the service that is to be performed by the contractor under this advertisement.*

16. Bidders must use the blanks for proposals furnished by the Department, which may be obtained at the post-office on each route herein advertised, or at the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General.

17. Every proposal must be accompanied with a bond by two or more sureties approved by a postmaster, and in cases where the amount of the bond exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000) the approval must be by a postmaster of the first, second, or third class; or the proposal must be accompanied with a bond by an approved surety company.

18. Postmasters are cautioned, under penalty of removal, not to sign the approval of the bond of any bidder before the proposal is completed, including the insertion of the rate at which the bidder proposes to carry the mail, the bond signed by the bidder and his sureties, and not until entirely satisfied of the sufficiency of his sureties; but where the bidder intends to give a surety company as sole surety on the bond, the postmaster may certify as to the bidder after the proposal and oath of bidder have been completed and the bond signed by the bidder, but before the bond has been signed by the surety company. *Postmasters are also cautioned not to divulge to anyone the amount of any proposal certified to by them. Doing so will be sufficient cause for their removal.*

Postmasters are also liable to dismissal from office for acting as agents of contractors, subcontractors, or bidders, with or without compensation, in any matter, business, or thing relating to the mail service. They are trusted agents of the Department and can not consistently act in both capacities.

19. Sureties on the bond of the bidder must take an oath before an officer qualified to administer oaths that they are the owners of real estate worth, in the aggregate, a sum double the amount of said bond, over and above all debts due and owing by them, and all judgments, mortgages, and executions against them, after allowing all exemptions, of every character whatever. A married woman will not be accepted as a surety, either on the bond of a bidder or upon a contract. Accompanying the bond of a bidder, and as a part thereof, shall be a statement of the sureties under oath, showing the amount of real estate owned by them, brief descriptions thereof, and its

probable value, where it is situated, and in what county and State the record evidence of their title exists. Any surety who swears falsely to this statement is deemed by the law guilty of perjury and is punishable as is prescribed by law for that crime.

20. A surety company which has complied with the provisions of the act approved August 13, 1894, will be accepted as sole surety on the bond accompanying the proposal and as sole surety on a contract for mail service, but the Department reserves the right to reject any surety company which as surety on a contract has previously refused or failed to provide the service on a route after the failure of the contractor or which has otherwise violated its obligations to the Department.

21. When the bond accompanying a proposal is executed by a surety company that has complied with the act approved August 13, 1894, the oath relative to ownership of real estate and the certificate of a postmaster, which are required as to individual sureties (as per forms on third page and first half of fourth page of the proposal blank), are not required as to the surety company, but in such cases the certificate of a postmaster is required as to the bidder (see form on last half of fourth page of proposal blank).

22. When a surety company that has complied with the provisions of the act approved August 13, 1894, executes a contract as sole surety the certificate of a postmaster, as per form on the contract blank, will not be required; but see sections 21 and 23 of these instructions.

23. When a surety company is tendered as surety, either on a bond accompanying a proposal or on a contract, there must be filed in the Post-Office Department a copy of the authority from the Attorney-General to such company to do business under said act and evidence that it has filed with the Attorney-General quarterly statements showing its assets and liabilities as required by said act; and also evidence that it has appointed, by a written power of attorney, some person as its agent residing within the jurisdiction of the court for the judicial district wherein such suretyship is to be undertaken, and that a copy of such power of attorney has been filed with the clerk of the district court of the United States for such district, in compliance with the provisions of the said act approved August 13, 1894.

24. Bidders are cautioned to forward their proposals in time to reach the Department, or to file them, by the day and hour named in this advertisement, as proposals received after that time will not be considered. If sent by mail or express ample time should be allowed for their transit, as they can not be deemed to be received at the Department until actually delivered at the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General; neither can proposals be considered which are without the bond, oath, or certificate required by the act of June 23, 1874, and the act of August 11, 1876. *No withdrawal of a proposal will be allowed unless the notice of withdrawal is received twenty-four hours previous to 4.30 p. m., January 5, 1909.*

25. A proposal altered in any of its essential terms can not be considered in competition with bids submitted in proper form. Nor can a bid, after having been submitted, be modified. A proposal may, however, be withdrawn within the time allowed for such action to be taken and a new proposal submitted in its stead.

26. The Postmaster-General reserves the right to suspend the award of service on any route for a period not exceeding thirty days

after the date set in this advertisement, with a corresponding allowance of time for the execution of the contract.

The Postmaster-General reserves the right to reject all bids on any route whenever in his judgment the interests of the service require it, and to disregard the bids of failing contractors and bidders, and bids accompanied with bonds on which there appears as surety the name of a person who is barred from bidding by reason of being a failing bidder or contractor, or who is barred from bidding for any other reason; also to disregard the bids of those persons whose proposals have not been submitted in good faith and with the intention to properly perform the services as contemplated by the terms of this advertisement.

27. All accepted bidders under this advertisement will be required to execute contracts with sureties to be approved by the Postmaster-General.

28. The contracts are to be executed and filed in the Department within thirty days from the date of acceptance of the bid; otherwise the accepted bidder will be considered as having failed, and the Postmaster-General may proceed to contract for the service with other parties, according to law.

29. In case of failure of the accepted bidder to execute a contract within the prescribed time, or of the abandonment of service during the contract term, the service will be relet at the expense of the failing bidder or contractor and his sureties, and any accepted bidder who shall wrongfully refuse or fail to enter into contract in due form, and to perform the service described in his proposal, may be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof be fined and imprisoned therefor.

30. No contract for carrying the mail shall be made with any person who has entered, or proposed to enter, into any combination to prevent the making of any bid for carrying the mail, or who has made any agreement, or given or performed, or promised to give or perform, any consideration whatever to induce any other person not to bid for any such contract.

31. No postmaster, assistant postmaster, or clerk employed in any post-office shall be a contractor or concerned in a contract for carrying the mail. Neither are such persons eligible as bidders for mail service. Nor will the husband or wife of a postmaster, or any member of a postmaster's immediate family, be permitted to become a mail contractor or subcontractor or to receive compensation for carrying the mails.

32. There will be no diminution of compensation for partial discontinuance of service or increase of compensation for increased service that may be ordered during the contract term as hereinbefore provided; but the Postmaster-General may discontinue the entire service under any contract on any route whenever the public interests, in his judgment, shall require such discontinuance, he allowing, as full indemnity to the contractor, one month's extra pay. The Postmaster-General reserves the right to rescind any acceptance of a proposal at any time before the signing on behalf of the United States of the formal contract without the allowance of any indemnity to the accepted bidder.

33. The Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, continue in force, beyond its express terms, for a period not exceeding six months,

any contract made under this advertisement until a new contract with the same or other contractors shall be made.

34. The Postmaster-General may annul the contract, in his discretion, for repeated failures or for failure to perform service according to contract; for violating the postal laws and regulations; for disobeying the instructions of the Post-Office Department; for refusing to discharge a driver or any other person handling mail under the contract when required by the Department; for subletting service without the consent of the Postmaster-General, or assigning or transferring the contract; for combining to prevent others from bidding for the performance of postal service; for transmitting out of the mail commercial intelligence or matter which should go by mail, or for transporting persons so engaged; for the failure of the contractor to give his personal supervision to the performance of the service or to reside on or contiguous to the route; whenever the contractor shall become a postmaster, assistant postmaster, or Member of Congress, and whenever, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, the service can not be safely continued or the laws maintained on the route. And such annulment shall not impair the right of the Department to claim damages from the contractor and his sureties.

35. Fines will be imposed for neglect of duty.

36. The service shall include the conveyance of all post-office blanks, mail locks and mail bags, and all other postal supplies.

37. Foreign mails in transit across the territory of the United States shall, within the meaning of this advertisement, be deemed and taken to be mails of the United States.

38. Contractors will be required to convey on the driver's seat of each wagon, whenever necessary, one railway post-office clerk, a substitute, or a messenger; and no person not having proper authority from the Department shall be permitted to ride on any of the contractor's wagons while the same is being used in the performance of service.

39. All service must be performed in regulation screen wagons constructed in accordance with plans and specifications issued by the Department September 15, 1904, with addenda of September 15, 1905. There are three sizes of regulation screen wagons, viz, No. 1 the large two-horse wagon, No. 2 the medium wagon for either one or two horses, and No. 3 the one-horse wagon. In cases where, in the judgment of the Department, regulation screen wagons are not necessary, permission may be given to perform a limited portion of the service in regulation mail carts, built in accordance with the plans and specifications furnished by the Department; but these carts must not be used without specific authority from the Second Assistant Postmaster-General.

40. Plans and specifications showing the style and construction of the wagons required may be seen at the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General and at the post-office in each city named in this advertisement, and will be furnished to contractors under this advertisement upon their application.

41. Only first-class wagons of the prescribed pattern will be accepted. The wagons (and carts, when used) must be kept painted and varnished in a thorough manner and ornamented according to specifications. The contractor must have the wagons varnished at least once during the first year of the contract term, and thoroughly

repainted and varnished with paints and varnishes of the best quality at least once each year thereafter during the contract term. They must be frequently washed and must be kept clean and in good condition. No lettering will be permitted on any part of the wagons other than such as is required by the specifications. THE WAGONS AND CARTS MUST BE NEW, OR, IF NOT NEW, BE REBUILT, WHEN NECESSARY, AND REPAINTED, AND BE SUBSTANTIALLY AS GOOD AS NEW AT THE BEGINNING OF THE CONTRACT TERM.

42. The horses used must be adapted to the work and must conform to the following specifications:

1. The horses shall be of good solid color—bay, brown, black, roan, chestnut, or gray preferred.

2. They shall be not less than 5 nor more than 10 years old.

3. They shall not stand less than 15 nor more than 16 hands high, and shall weigh not less than 1,100 nor more than 1,400 pounds.

4. They shall be in proportion as to height and weight; of kind disposition and free from bad habits, sound, well broken to harness, and in perfect condition.

All horses used in the performance of service will be subject to rigid monthly inspections during the contract term and the contractor will be required to take out of service any animal that does not meet these requirements.

The horses must be kept in first-class condition at all times and the cruel treatment of any animal while in the performance of service will be sufficient cause for imposing a fine on the contractor or requiring the dismissal of the employee responsible for the act, or both.

43. Harness of good quality, adapted to the work, must be provided.

44. The number of wagons and carts furnished must be sufficient for the prompt and proper performance of the service. The postmaster must require the contractor on beginning service to furnish the number and kinds of wagons and carts specified under the schedule of service for each route. If additional equipment becomes necessary during the contract term, the postmaster must report the facts to the Second Assistant Postmaster-General.

45. The contractor will be required to provide and keep on hand a sufficient number of extra wagons to take the place of those which may be temporarily disabled, delayed waiting for trains, withdrawn from service for repairs, required by the increase of service or for special or advance trips, so that the service shall always be promptly performed in wagons of the required kind.

46. When mails are delayed in arrival, wagons must be at the depots or landings upon the arrival of such mails, and the same be conveyed to their proper destination without detention. Except in cases of accident, wagons containing mail must not be opened or the mails therein contained changed while in transit between the points named in this advertisement. The mails must be carried inside of the wagons, with doors securely locked, and not on the outside or on the seat with the driver, and in no case shall any person be allowed to ride inside of the wagon containing mail.

47. Subject to the approval of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General, the wagons, horses, harness, drivers, and service are to be at all times under the control of the postmaster, and the mails are to be taken from and delivered into the post-offices, mail stations, steamboats, railroad stations, and cars at such points and at such

hours as will secure dispatches and connections, and at the contractor's expense for tolls and ferriage.

48. The equipment of the contractor shall be subject to inspection before acceptance, at the commencement of the service, and to inspection at least once each month by the postmaster and by an agent of the Department when designated for that purpose.

The wagons, when new ones are proposed to be built, shall be subject to inspection: (1) In the shop when the running gear and bed have been put together; (2) when painted and completed and before going into service.

The refusal or failure of the contractor to keep his wagons, horses, or harness in condition herein required to the satisfaction of the Department, or to furnish proper drivers, so as to perform the service in a style satisfactory to the Department, shall be sufficient cause for the imposing of suitable fines and penalties for each day that he fails in any particular to comply with such requirements, and for continued failure to comply with the instructions and replace unsuitable horses, wagons, harness, or drivers, in accordance with instructions, he may, in addition, be declared a failing contractor, and the service be relet and he and his sureties be held liable for any damages that may be suffered thereby.

49. The wagons for each city must be numbered consecutively from one up, and the number must not be changed on any wagon within the contract term without permission from the Department.

50. Drivers must be over sixteen years of age, of good moral character, able to read and write the English language, and be familiar with the streets, location of railroad stations, mail stations, etc., in the city in which they are employed. They must take the oath required by law, and must wear the cap or hat, with badge, prescribed by the Department.

The contractor will be permitted to employ as wagon drivers, or other employees engaged in handling the mail, only such persons as are of good moral character and who have satisfied the postmaster or his representative (subject to the approval of the Department) that they have the character and ability to properly perform the duties required of them. They will be required to pass such examination and furnish such recommendations as will fairly demonstrate their qualifications and fitness.

51. Should the contractor fail to promptly provide efficient service after his attention has been called to delinquencies, the Department may, in addition to imposing fines for past derelictions, order the removal of any of the contractor's employees and, if deemed advisable, authorize the employment of temporary service over the entire route, at the expense of the contractor, until such time as he shall provide suitable employees to take the place of those at fault.

52. Specifications for cap to be worn by driver: Cap—To be of all-wool blue flannel of good quality, three and one-fourth inches high, solid leather fronts one and three-fourths inches deep, with one small regulation P. O. D. button on each side, a silver wreath in front inclosing the words "U. S. Mail," and to have one oiled linen cover. During the summer season the drivers will be permitted to wear a straw hat or a straw cap of good quality and of uniform style, in lieu of the cloth cap. The regulation badge above described to be worn on the front of such hat or cap. In severe winter weather the drivers

will be permitted to wear warm woolen caps of a uniform appearance, with regulation badge on front.

53. Assignments of contracts or of interest in contracts are forbidden by law, consequently can not be allowed. Neither can bids nor interest in bids be transferred or assigned to other parties. Bidders will therefore take notice that they will be expected to perform the service awarded to them through the whole contract term.

54. Special attention is invited to that part of the law prohibiting the subletting of mail contracts without the consent of the Postmaster-General.

As each contractor under this advertisement will be expected to reside on or contiguous to the route on which he contracts to carry the mail, and to give his personal supervision to the performance of the service, the Department will not favor a proposition to delegate such duty to a subcontractor unless there shall be some special and substantial reason therefor. The needs of the service justify the Department in expecting that, under competitive bidding, limited to persons residing on or contiguous to the routes, who will give their personal supervision to the performance of the service, the full amount named in the contract shall be paid to the person actually performing or supervising the service. Therefore applications for permission to sublet should state:

- (a) The special reason why the service should be sublet;
- (b) The name and address of the proposed subcontractor;
- (c) The amount of compensation to be paid him.

If permission to sublet a mail contract be granted, it will be subject to the conditions set forth in the following sections.

By act of Congress of May 17, 1878, the following provisions are made relative to the subletting of mail contracts:

Sec. 2. Hereafter no subletting or transfer of any mail contracts shall be permitted without the consent, in writing, of the Postmaster-General; and whenever it shall come to the knowledge of the Postmaster-General that any contractor has sublet or transferred his contract, except with the consent of the Postmaster-General as aforesaid, the same shall be considered as violated, and the service may be again advertised as herein provided for; and the contractor and his sureties shall be liable on their bond to the United States for any damage resulting to the United States in the premises.

Sec. 3. Hereafter, when any person or persons being under contract with the Government of the United States for carrying the mails, shall lawfully sublet any such contract, or lawfully employ any other person or persons to perform the service by such contractor agreed to be performed, or any part thereof, he or they shall file in the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General a copy of his or their contract; and thereupon it shall be the duty of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General to notify the Auditor of the Treasury for the Post-Office Department of the fact of the filing in his office of such contract. Said notice shall embrace the name or names of the original contractor or contractors, the number of the route or routes, the name or names of the subcontractor or subcontractors, and the amount agreed to be paid to the subcontractor or subcontractors. And upon the receipt of said notice by the Auditor of the Treasury for the Post-Office Department, it shall be his duty to retain out of the amount due the original contractor or contractors the amount stated in said notice as agreed to be paid to the subcontractor or subcontractors, and shall pay said amount upon the certificate of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General to the subcontractor or subcontractors, under the same rules and regulations now governing the payments made to the original contractors: *Provided*, That upon satisfactory evidence that the original contractor or contractors have paid off and discharged the amount due under his or their contract to the subcontractor or subcontractors it shall be the duty of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General to certify such fact to the Auditor of the Treasury for the Post-Office Department; and thereupon said Auditor shall

settle with the original contractor or contractors under the same rules as are now provided by law for such settlements.

55. Contractors must in all cases secure the permission of the Postmaster-General before making a subcontract on any route.

56. Subcontracts executed and filed in accordance with the provisions of the act of May 17, 1878, will be subject also to the act of May 4, 1882, which is as follows:

That whenever any contractor or subcontractor shall sublet his contract for the transportation of the mail on any route for a less sum than that for which he contracted to perform the service, the Postmaster-General may, whenever he shall deem it for the good of the service, declare the original contract at an end and enter into a contract with the last subcontractor, without advertising, to perform the service on the terms at which the last subcontractor agreed with the original contractor or former subcontractor to perform the same; *Provided*, That such last subcontractor shall enter into a good and sufficient bond, and that the original contractor shall not be released from his contract until a good and sufficient bond has been made by such last subcontractor and accepted by the Post-Office Department: *Provided further*, That when a contract hereafter made is declared void on account of its having been sublet, the contractor shall not be entitled to one month's extra pay as provided for by law: *And provided further*, That if any person shall hereafter perform any service for any contractor or subcontractor in carrying the mail, he shall, upon filing in the Department his contract for such service and satisfactory evidence of its performance, thereafter have a lien on any money due such contractor or subcontractor for such service to the amount of the same; and if such contractor or subcontractor shall fail to pay the party or parties who have performed services as aforesaid the amount due for such service within two months after the expiration of the quarter in which such service shall have been performed, the Postmaster-General may cause the amount due to be paid to said party or parties and charged to the contractor, provided that such payment shall not in any case exceed the rate of pay per annum of the contractor or subcontractor: *And provided further*, That where any person, corporation, or partnership shall have contracts for the performance of mail service upon more than one route, and any failure to perform the service according to contract on any one or more of such routes shall occur, no payment shall be made for service on any of the routes under contract with such person, corporation, or partnership until such failure has been removed and all penalties therefor fully satisfied.

CONDITIONS OF PERMISSION TO SUBLET.

57. The subcontract must be executed for service upon the whole route and for a period of not less than one year, or for the remainder of the contract term when less than one year, and it must be filed by the contractor in the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General within thirty days after the time when service is to begin under it.

58. The subcontractor must be a resident of a locality upon or contiguous to the route; but no postmaster, assistant postmaster, clerk employed in a post-office, member of the immediate family of a postmaster, or surety on the bond of a postmaster will be permitted to enter into a subcontract for mail service or to carry the mail as employee of a contractor.

59. The subcontract must be executed in the form prescribed by the Postmaster-General in Blank No. 2702, and must specify the rate to be paid *per annum* under it, in case the service shall be changed; must stipulate that the subcontractor shall assume liability for fines and deductions and that he shall receive *pro rata* of the *one month's extra pay* allowed contractor for curtailment, reduction, or discontinuance of service.

60. None of the stipulations of the subcontract (Form No. 2702) are to be eliminated therefrom, and no collateral stipulations of any character whatever are to be added thereto.

61. The execution of a subcontract on any route without permission, or, if after permission, in violation of these instructions, renders the original contract liable to annulment.

62. The schedule on a route will not be changed to meet the convenience of a contractor, subcontractor, or carrier unless an investigation shall show that such change will in no way be detrimental to the service.

63. Neither the permission to sublet nor the recognition of the subcontractor made in pursuance thereof shall be construed as releasing the contractor from any of the obligations of his contract with the United States. (See section 3963, Revised Statutes.)

64. The word "transfer," as used in section 2 of the law above quoted, is declared to be synonymous with sublet, and does not permit in any case the absolute transfer of a mail contract.

65. By a decision of the Attorney-General the provisions of this law are applicable to all mail contracts.

66. The evidence of payment of a subcontractor by a contractor, provided for in section 3 of the act of May 17, 1878, must be the receipt of the subcontractor, attested by a postmaster at the post-office on the route sublet, on a form approved by the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General.

67. A subcontractor may avail himself of the benefits of the laws and receive payment from the Post-Office Department direct by filing a copy of his subcontract in the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General, furnishing therewith his post-office address. No subcontractor can be paid by the Department for service at a greater rate than that named in the original contract.

68. No subcontract can be recognized unless made with the original contractor.

69. When a contractor executes a subcontract at a rate of pay higher than the contract rate, and such subcontract has been recognized and payments made by the Department to the subcontractor at the contract rate of pay, it becomes an imperative duty of the contractor to simultaneously provide for paying to the subcontractor the sum due him in excess of the amount paid by the Department; and failure to make suitable provision and actual payment will be considered as sufficient ground to cause the name of the contractor to be entered upon the list of those who are barred from recognition by the Department as bidders or as sureties for mail service.

70. The following is a form of proposal properly filled in:

Proposal. Regulation screen-wagon service, city of *Albany, N. Y.*, route No. *407001*. The undersigned, *Richard Roe*, whose post-office address is *Albany, county of Albany, State of New York*, proposes to carry the mails of the United States from July 1, 1909, to June 30, 1913, on above-numbered route, being the regulation screen-wagon service in the city of *Albany, State of New York*, under the advertisement of the Postmaster-General dated October 24, 1908, and subject to all the requirements and conditions contained therein, for the sum of *two hundred and ten and $\frac{50}{100}$* dollars per annum; and if this proposal is accepted he will enter into contract, with sureties to be approved by the Postmaster-General, within thirty days after the date of acceptance, and will give his personal supervision to the performance of the service and will reside on or contiguous to the route.

This proposal is made in my own interest and not as the agent or representative of another person or company, and after due inquiry into and with full knowledge of all particulars in reference to the service, and also after careful examination of the conditions attached to said advertisement, and with intent to be governed thereby.

PROPOSALS ILLEGIBLY WRITTEN WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

NOTE.—When the oath is taken before a justice of the peace, or any other officer not using a seal, except a judge of a United States court, the certificate of the clerk of a court of record must be added, under his seal of office, that the person who administered the oath is duly qualified as such officer.

A postmaster is not qualified to administer the above oath.

The proposal must be signed by the bidder or each of the bidders and the date of signing affixed.

Now, therefore, the said contractor and his sureties do, jointly and severally, undertake, covenant, and agree with the United States of America, and do bind themselves—

First. To carry said mail in a safe and secure manner, using therefor substantial one or two horse regulation screen wagons, of the kind more fully described in the advertisement above referred to, in sufficient number and of sufficient capacity to transport the whole of said mail, whatever may be its size, weight, or increase during the term of this contract, and within the time fixed in said advertisement; the wagons to be new or substantially as good as new at the beginning of the contract term; of first-class material and construction, suitable for the proper performance of the service, affording complete protection to the mails from depredation, inclement weather, or other injury, to be kept thoroughly painted, cleaned, and in good condition at all times, and subject in all respects to the approval of the Postmaster-General.

Second. To take the mail from, and deliver it into, the post-office _____ and cars at such points and at such hours, under the directions of the postmaster at said city, approved by the Postmaster-General, as will secure dispatches and connections and facilitate distribution, and at the contractor's expense for tolls and ferrage.

Third. To furnish the number of said wagons (of the required sizes) that, in the opinion of the postmaster at said city, approved by the Postmaster-General, will be sufficient for the prompt and proper performance of the service, including extra wagons to take the place of those that may be temporarily unserviceable, delayed waiting for trains, withdrawn from service for repairs, or required for special or advanced trips.

Fourth. To be accountable and answerable in damages to the United States, or any person aggrieved, for the faithful performance by the said contractor of all the duties and obligations herein assumed, or which are now or may hereafter be imposed upon him by law in this behalf; and, further, to be so answerable and accountable in damages for the careful and faithful conduct of the person or persons who may be employed by said contractor and to whom the said contractor shall commit the care or transportation of the mails, and for the faithful performance of the duties which are or may be by law imposed upon such person or persons in the care or transportation of said mails; and, further, that said contractor shall not commit the care or transportation of the mails to any person under 16 years of age, or any person undergoing a sentence of imprisonment at hard labor imposed by a court having criminal jurisdiction, or to any person who has not satisfied the postmaster or his representative (subject to the approval of the Department) that he has good moral character and ability to perform the service, has taken the oath prescribed by law, can read and write the English language, and has passed the required examination and furnished the necessary recommendations as to his qualifications and fitness.

Fifth. To discharge any driver, or other person employed in performing mail service, whenever required by the Postmaster-General so to do; not to transmit by themselves, or any of them, or any of their agents, or be concerned in transmitting commercial intelligence more rapidly than by mail; not to carry otherwise than in the mail letters, packets, or newspapers which should go by mail.

Sixth. To account for and pay over any money belonging to the United States which may come into the possession of the contractor, his sureties, or employees.

Seventh. That foreign mails in transit across the territory of the United States shall, within the meaning of this contract, be deemed and taken to be mails of the United States.

Eighth. To carry post-office blanks, mail locks, and mail bags, and all other postal supplies.

Ninth. To convey, when requested so to do, one railway post-office clerk, a substitute, or a messenger on the driver's seat of each wagon.

Tenth. To perform, without additional compensation, any and all additional service that the Postmaster-General may order during the contract term between post-offices, between the post-office and railroad stations, between the post-office and steamboat landings, between the post-office and mail stations, between the post-office and the points of exchange with electric or cable cars, and between the several post-offices, railroad stations, steamboat landings, mail stations, or points of exchange with electric or cable cars named in the schedule of service for said route in said advertisement. Also to perform, without additional compensation, any and all additional service during the contract term that may be caused by changes of site of said post-offices, railroad stations, steamboat landings, mail stations, or points of exchange with electric or cable cars, and to and from any new railroad station within the city used by a company named in the schedule of service, and also such mail-messenger service as may be necessary between the post-office and a new railroad using the depot of a railroad named in the schedule of service and such transfer and mail-station service as may be necessary to and from such railroad; provided, that in the case of a mail station the increase in distance traveled by reason of such change of site does not exceed one-quarter of a mile per trip each way; the discontinuance of a mail station and the establishment of another in its stead not involving an increase in travel of more than one-quarter of a mile each way per trip to be regarded as a change of site, and no additional pay to be allowed for the increased service caused by such change.

Eleventh. It is further agreed that the contractor or carrier shall not transport intoxicating liquors from one point to another on this route while in the performance of mail service.

For which service, when properly performed and the evidence thereof shall have been filed in the office of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General, the said contractor is to be paid by the United States at the rate per annum hereinbefore named; payments to be made monthly, or as soon after the close of each month as accounts can be adjusted and settled, said pay to be subject, however, to be reduced or discontinued by the Postmaster-General as hereinafter stipulated, or to be suspended and withheld in case of delinquency.

It is hereby stipulated and agreed by said contractor and his sureties that the Postmaster-General may change the schedule, vary, increase, or decrease the trips on this route, or extend the trips to any new location of the post-offices, railroad stations, steamboat landings, mail stations, or points of exchange with cable or electric cars named in the schedule of service for said route in said advertisement, without change of pay; provided, that in case of a mail station the increase in distance traveled to and from such new location does not exceed one-quarter of a mile each way per trip; and that the Postmaster-General may discontinue the entire service under this contract whenever the public interest, in his judgment, shall require such discontinuance, but for a total discontinuance of service the contractor shall be allowed one month's extra pay as full indemnity.

And it is further stipulated and agreed that for a failure to deliver the mail not beyond the control of the contractor, or for any delay or interference with the prompt delivery of the mail at the places required herein, or for carrying the mail in a manner different or inferior to that hereinbefore specified, for suffering the mail to be wet, injured, lost, or destroyed, or for any other delinquency or omission of duty under this contract; for all or any of which the contractor shall forfeit, and there may be withheld from his pay, such sum as the Postmaster-General may impose as fines or deductions, according to the nature and frequency of the failure or delinquency.

And it is further stipulated and agreed that the Postmaster-General may annul this contract for repeated failures or for failure to perform service according to contract; for violating the postal laws and regulations; for disobeying the instructions of the Post-Office Department; for refusing to discharge a driver or any other person handling mail under the contract when required by the Department; for subletting the service without the consent of the Postmaster-General, or for assigning or transferring the contract; for combining to prevent others from bidding for the performance of postal service; for transmitting, out of the mail, commercial intelligence or matter which should go by mail, contrary to the stipulations herein, or for transporting persons so engaged; for the failure of the contractor to give his personal supervision to the performance of the service or to reside on or contiguous to the route; whenever the contractor

shall become a postmaster, assistant postmaster, or Member of Congress, and whenever, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, the service can not be safely continued, the revenues collected, or the laws maintained.

And it is further stipulated and agreed that such annulment shall not impair the right of the United States to claim damages from said contractor and his sureties under this contract: but such damages may, for the purpose of set-off or counterclaim, in the settlement of any claim of said contractor or his sureties against the United States, whether arising under this contract or otherwise, be assessed and liquidated by the Auditor for the Post-Office Department.

And it is hereby further stipulated and agreed by the said contractor and his sureties that this contract may, in the discretion of the Postmaster-General, be continued in force beyond its express terms for a period not exceeding six months, until a new contract with the same or another contractor shall be made by the Postmaster-General.

And it is further stipulated that no Member of or Delegate to Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract or to any benefit to arise therefrom.

And this contract is further to be subject to all the conditions imposed by law and the several acts of Congress relating to post-offices and post-roads.

In witness whereof the said Postmaster-General has caused the seal of the Post-Office Department to be hereto affixed and has caused the same to be attested by the signature of the Second Assistant Postmaster-General, in accordance with the act of Congress approved March 3, 1877 (sec. 3, 19 Stats., p. 335), and the said contractor and his sureties have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year set opposite their names, respectively.
