Dear CMS Folks:

My letter is to express the strongest support possible for the proposed increase in anesthesia payments under the 2008 Physician Fee Schedule.

The original RBRVS system disproportionately penalized anesthesiologists (compared to surgeons caring for the same patients), and this has only gotten worse as our population has gotten older, sicker, and more complicated with longer medication lists (which tends to complicate the anesthesia significantly more than the surgery -- the surgery for a 40 year-old and an 80 year-old total hip patient are much the same, but the anesthesia is VERY different).

Anesthesia in the United States has had a 30-fold increase in safety over the past 20+ years, yet we have had larger Medicare cuts than many other specialties that have had very minimal improvements in safety. Anesthesia residencies are longer than ever (now 5 years for many) because of the ever-increasing complexity of our patients.

Having practised in both West Virginia and more recently Nevada during the past 5 years, I have noted high and ever-increasing proportions of Medicare patients, with considerable demographic growth of retirees in both states. With the 8.9% 2006 pay cuts from Medicare, the pay for providing anesthesia care for doing older, sicker, and more complex patients is now down to about 1/3 of levels paid by private insurance policies for doing similar cases on younger, healthier, and much simpler patients. The result is that we are punishing experienced anesthesiologists who choose practices with a high percentage of Medicare patients. In order to pay increasing overhead, living expenses, and malpractice insurance costs, anesthesiologists are being forced toward practices that serve fewer Medicare patients, leaving significant numbers of very sick Medicare patients with less-experienced anesthesia providers. Certain anesthesiologists who serve particular surgeons (such as those who do large numbers of patients for total joint replacements or other geriatric-centered procedures) are penalized tens of thousands of dollars annually just by having a practice that is 2/3 Medicare, and the financial penalty is even worse if the anesthesiologist spends the extra time and attention that these retirees really deserve. Of course there are non-monetary rewards for serving America's retirees, but it is difficult to pay one's insurance premiums with these intangible benefits.

In any case, no matter how you look at it -- whether from a practical approach, a work-based approach, an education-based concept, or just what is 'fair' for both patient and anesthesiologist -- a \$4.00 increase per anesthesia unit would go a long way toward fixing the problem, even though that will still leave Medicare paying less than half the rate of many private insurers.

Thank you for your attention and consideration toward reducing the current 'penalty' that Medicare gives to anesthesiologists who care for large numbers of Medicare patients.
