I am writing to argue strongly in favor of the proposed increase in the anesthesia conversion factor.

I am an anesthesiologist in private practice and I can tell you that medicare grossly underpays me for what I do, by a factor of at least 66%. Medicare payments are well under a third of what I get from private insurance, and are so paltry that our group actually loses money on every medicare patient we take care of, when you take into account the anesthesia personnel costs associated with taking care of these patients. In addition, medicare patients, being generally older, also tend to be sicker and require more, not less care, than the corresponding younger population. So in effect when we take care of medicare patients we take care of older, sicker, more clinically challenging and difficult patients, all for less money. Not just a little less money, but so little that we lose money on each case. As you might imagine, this provides a negative incentive for treating these patients.

As a comparison, my surgical colleagues tell me that medicare pays them 80% to 100% of what they can expect form private insurance. Why are we as anesthesiologists penalized?

I am not a greedy doctor trying to 'rip off' the government. I am just a humble physician asking to get paid a fair amount for a fair job, just like my surgeon colleagues.

I am writing in regard to CMS-1385-P Anesthesia Coding and the proposed increase in the RBRVS. I stongly support this increase and thank you for your consideration. This would right the unintentional undervalueing of anesthesia services by the current RBRVS system.

Currently about 1/3 of anesthesia groups are subsidized by hospitals here in the USA. This is especially true in heavy medicare regions. It makes sense why some high proportion medicare areas are then underserved. Currently Medicare pays \$16.19 per unit with payment of four units per hour plus start up, but nothing for set up or cancelled cases. That is \$64.76 per hour. I'm sure you understand that one would be hard pressed to find a plumber or electrician that would work for that wage. This is a gross undervaluation compared to other specialties.

The RUC has recommended that CMS increase the conversion factor by almost \$4.00 which is still short of the calculated 32% undervaluation, but would go a long way in correcting this defecit and ensuring access for our seniors.

I am glad that the Agency has accepted RUC's recommendation in its pending rule and ask you to fully implement such rule.

For too long Medicare has been grossly under reimbursing doctors for Anesthesia related patient care. Whereas most specialties can expect 120 to 140% of Medicare from private payors for close to reasonable payment, the private payors realize they must pay in excess of 300% of Medicare rates for anesthesiology services. This puts hospital with high Medicare populations at risk of having vanishing anesthesia coverage. With the aging population, the percentage of medicare patients increases in retirement areas and this makes recruiting anesthesia providers to these regions next to impossible. We do not believe that the US should do what Great Britain has done; i.e. be forced to recruit terrorist MDs from underdeveloped countries to provide healthcare for our senior citizens. Dear Ms. Norwalk:

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I have worked through remarkable change in the last several years. Private practice models are not viable where seniors represent a substantial population. I have witnessed the breakup of three anesthesiology groups in three distinctly separate and different communities. Anesthesiologists are then sought for employment in subsidized situations. This shifts the loss taken to the employer, which is usually the hospital and results in an increase in the number of travelling physicians. In turn, hospitals are destabilized.

All of this shuffling causes an increase to the overall cost of care due to a variety of factors. Principally, the higher turnover of surgical teams leads to a loss of efficiency, standardization, and the inability to pursue sustained performance improvement efforts. Most concerning is the increase in risk to patient safety that is introduced when people work in unfamiliar environments. The RUC-based proposal gets to the root of this difficult problem.

I am writing to express my strongest support for the proposal to increase anesthesia payments under the 2008 Physician Fee Schedule. I am grateful that CMS has recognized the gross undervaluation of anesthesia services, and that the Agency is taking steps to address this complicated issue.
