

PROCEDURE TO COMPLETE REQUIRED ELECTRICAL SAFETY INSPECTION

This inspection is required to improve your safety and the safety of the public. Inspections are required upon installation or purchase of existing facilities and every five years thereafter.

Wiring must meet current electrical codes. If not, repairs must be completed and a second electrical permit for re-inspection will be necessary.

An approved electrical inspection permit must be received by this office within 180 days from the date the new license is mailed to the grantee. Failure to provide the approved electrical inspection will render the electrical license issued by this office null and void. Without a valid license the electrical facilities must be removed from public property. Failure to submit the approved electrical permit or remove the electrical facilities from public property will result in the issuance of a Title 36 citation with a mandatory court appearance.

To obtain the electrical inspection permit go to Hendersonville City Hall at 1 Executive Park Drive, Codes and Planning Office, room 121 or call (615) 822-3802. The State Issue Agent will provide your name and address to the inspector who will perform the inspection **within 45 days**. Once the electrical facility on public property is inspected and meets current electrical codes the inspector will fax a copy of your permit to this office. The designated inspector is Gerald Capps; he can be reached at (615) 824-1563 or (615) 430-1432 if you have any questions.

Please keep in mind that:

- The electrical service must have a disconnect above flood pool elevation (451 feet above mean sea level) that allows the service to be turned off quickly in case of an emergency.
- The electrical installation must be according to the National Electrical Code (NEC).
- The location of security lights must be pre-approved. These lights must be low-intensity. Motion sensors and timers are recommended.
- Overhead electric lines will not be permitted unless natural conditions preclude underground installation as determined by the Resource Manager.
