USDA ANNOUNCES UPDATED 2002-CROP STATE SUGAR-MARKETING ALLOTMENTS AND ALLOCATIONS

WASHINGTON, May 19, 2003 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) today announced state cane allotments and beet and cane processor allocations. The revisions are based on the May 13, 2003, increase in the overall allotment quantity (OAQ) for domestic sugar to 8.663 million short tons, raw value (STRV), and the reassignment of unused cane and beet sugar allocations between respective processors.

The beet sugar allotment increased to 4,708,341 STRV, but CCC determined that the beet sector can only fulfill 4,534,341 STRV of this allotment, leaving 77,641 STRV to be reassigned among beet processors. The remaining unfulfilled portion of the beet sugar allotment, 174,000 STRV, is reassigned to CCC for sale of inventory. On Jan. 15, 2003, CCC announced the reassignment of 182,000 tons of surplus beet sugar allotment to CCC, but noted that the amount was subject to change based on the results of a processor survey to be completed by May 1, 2003. In April 2003, CCC sent a 2002-crop production/marketing survey to cane and beet processors. The survey results led to this revision in the beet sector reassignment to CCC.

The cane sugar allotment increased to 3,954,660 STRV, but CCC determined that the cane sector can only fulfill 3,944,660 STRV of this allotment. The remaining unfulfilled portion of the cane sugar allotment, 10,000 STRV, is reassigned to CCC for sale of inventory. However, CCC is not reducing the cane sector allotment by the 10,000 STRV reassigned to CCC at this time because of uncertainties in the individual company production estimates, particularly in Hawaii and Texas, where the sugarcane harvest is still underway.

Final allotments/allocations (Column F of the attached table) were calculated as follows:

Beet Sector:

♦ Allotments/allocations were changed to incorporate the 77,641 STRV increase in the beet sugar allotment (Column C of the attached table).

♦ Allocations were reassigned from beet processors with unused allocation, as indicted in the April 2003 survey for the current year, to those indicating an allocation shortfall (Column E of the attached table).

Cane Sector:

- ♦ Allotments/allocations were changed to incorporate the 211,360 STRV increase in the cane sugar allotment and the updated 2002-crop production/marketing estimates (Column C of the attached table).
- ♦ Allocation was taken from processors with surplus allocation and reassigned to processors with surplus supply within the same state. This occurred for Florida and Louisiana (Column D of the attached table).
- ♦ The remaining excess allocation of Louisiana that could not be eliminated by reassignment within Louisiana plus excess allocations from Hawaii and Puerto Rico were reassigned to cane processors in Florida and Texas, who revealed in the same survey a shortfall in allocation for the current crop year (Column E of the attached table).

The revised 2002-crop cane sugar state marketing allotments and processor allocations are listed in the following table:
