This funding provides support to the Afghanistan troop rotation announced by the President. The funding includes:

- ~3,700 troops in a brigade combat team in anticipation of increased Taliban and insurgent activities (\$272 million)
- ~3,500 troops needed to accelerate the planned training and equipping of the Afghan National Security Forces (\$139 million)
- Intelligence, linguists, and minor construction to support the troop plus up in Afghanistan (\$99 million)
- Creation of a Medical Support Fund to support medical treatment of armed forces members (\$50 million)

These increases were partially offset by decreases in the following:

- Funding not required for information technology system and support activities (-\$50 million)
- Savings from lower than projected fuel prices (-\$80 million)

Funds added to procure the Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicle. The supplemental amendment provides \$500 million, equally divided between the Army and the Marine Corps for Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicles. MRAP meets an urgent theater need for an urban fighting vehicle designed for ordnance removal, route clearance, troop transport, and lead convoy missions. The vehicles have V-shaped hulls that provide an immediate and dramatic increase in underbody protection. The V-shaped hull sends the blast from an IED outward instead of directly up, which increases survivability and mobility.

Changes reflect the addition of funds to support the economic support fund for Pakistan. To promote economic development and enhance security in Pakistan border areas, \$110.0 million will be transferred to the Department of State to assist Pakistan's efforts to develop the autonomous FATA along the Pakistan-Afghanistan border. These funds are required to implement the Administration's strategy for defeating the Taliban and other insurgents in Afghanistan. Resources will enable the immediate launch and implementation of the Government of Pakistan's recently finalized FATA Development Plan. The funds would be used to build the capacity of institutions, build critical infrastructure in the region, and expand USAID projects currently underway. Despite the progress Pakistan has made toward economic and security reform overall, the Tribal Areas remain chronically underdeveloped and offer safe havens and recruiting grounds for terrorists. Lack of funding will allow the conditions to persist that have made the region a breeding ground for terrorists, hindering U.S. and coalition operations in the region and increasing the risk to allies and the homeland.

The proposed reduction of \$50 million is for the lift and sustainment funding no longer required of a coalition partner. This funding was planned for the transportation which can now be leased at lower cost.

- ~2,200 military police and ordnance disposal personnel to handle the expected increase in detainees and increased bomb threats resulting from operations of the increased number of troops in Iraq (\$327 million)
- Additional operating and logistics support (\$356 million)
- Force protection primarily add-on armor and vehicles to support theater transportation requirements (\$1,005 million)
- Funding realigned to the above activities due to a reduction in the original funding estimate for Navy ship deployments (-\$805 million)

The Task Force to Improve Business and Stability Operations – Iraq will help re-start over 140 Iraqi factories during the next 6 to 18 months, employing up to 150,000 people. Most of these factories are viable industrial entities and can serve as an engine for private sector industry, agricultural production, and service sector economic activity in Iraq. Over the past six months, the Government of Iraq, and the Departments of Defense, State, and the Treasury have assessed Iraqi factories, prepared feasibility studies and business plans, and reached out to potential Iraqi and international firms that could purchase manufactured products. The requested funding would be used to procure machines, tools, and generators needed to re-start these factories. Generating employment for Iraqis is a key component of America's effort to help bring peace and stability to the country.

The PRT program is a critical element of the U.S. counter-insurgency strategy jointly executed by the Department of State and the Department of Defense. Its purpose is to bolster moderates, promote reconciliation and shape the political environment, support economic development, and build the capacity of Iraqi provincial governments to hasten the transition to Iraqi self-sufficiency.

These funds would support secure theater airlift and ground transportation for the PRTs in Iraq and provide force protection, body armor, and clothing for all PRT personnel collocated with the military, including those operating out of military forward operating bases and in embedded teams. In addition, these funds would provide special pay and benefits for 129 deployed civilians, personnel hired to backfill these civilians, travel, and training. The Department of State will fund operational and life support requirements for these PRT members.
