Legislation regarding newborn hearing screening? If yes, does the legislation mandate or provide funds for newborn hearing screening and follow-up services?	Yes Legislation creating the New Jersey Hearing Program was passed in 1977. The NJ Department of Health began newborn hearing screening in 1980 for at-risk babies only. The mandate has been amended to include a phase-in process to replace risk-based screening. Universal newborn screening was initiated in 2002. NJ now mandates that hearing screening be offered and results of hearing screenings be reported to the EHDI program.

State/territory requires parental consent for hearing screening(s) to be done at the time of birth?	Yes Parents must sign a form before a hearing screening can be given at birth. The screening can be refuse hearing screening for religious reasons.
What happens if a baby does not pass the initial hearing screening(s)?	Referred for diagnostic audiological evaluation Babies who do not pass the hearing screening are brought back to audiology for evaluation. The hospital sends reminder postcards.
Birthing hospitals/facilities/providers required to report hearing screening results to the state?	Yes EBC: screening done (yes/no), screening results, risk factors; results of follow up testing on form.
How birthing hospitals/facilities report hearing screening information to the state/territory	100% of individual-level screening results are receive on the EBC. Hospitals are required to report screening results to the state under NJ law and hearing screening rules. All hospitals use the EBC, and transmit data via modem to the Department of Health and Senior Services at least once a week.

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Hearing screening results reported to the infant's physician? [If yes, are all results reported or only failed screening?]	Notify all screening results ("Refer" and Pass) Hospitals are encouraged to provide screening results to the primary care providers. Parents and the infants' pediatricians are informed of the screening results (verbally and by letter)

Yes NJ mandates that audiological evaluations be reported to the EHDI program. NJ seeks to obtain audiological evaluation data for all occurrent births below a given age that obtain an audiological evaluation, including children with risk factors.

Type of system program uses to track hearing screening and follow-up information	NJ has a "Home grown" system developed by state personnel. The NJ program obtains birth certificate data for all occurrent births. The NJ program receives individual-level data for ALL hearing screens.

How program addresses de- duplication of screening and diagnostic evaluation data	The NJ program address de-duplication of screening data after data entry, staff search for possible matches. Diagnostic evaluation data is addressed during data entry, software checks for approximate or probabilistic matches. If it is determined that two records belong to the same individual, it is
	possible to combine these two records under the same ID number without re-entering all of the data for one of the records.
	If two records have been combined into a single record, but then it is determined that this was an error, it is not possible to "undo" this and re-create the original, separate records under different ID numbers without re-entering the data.
