This CD will not play in any of the CD-ROM drives in my computers or in the low-end DVD player I use at home. The DVD player has the Phillips-licensed CD logo on it, indicating it plays CDs). There is no warning on the lable, either explicit or implied, indicating playback restrictions; it just doesn't play. I do most of my music-listening on computer while I work (both at my place of employment and my home office). My computers are extensively equipped for music playback during other work, and this is important for my personal workstyle. Without the DCMA, my software could legally read and play such recordings. These attempts to control how media is read are highly consumerhostile.
