Dislocated Occupations Method

Every two years, the Oregon Employment Department develops 10-year projections of employment by industries and occupations. The most recent projections are for the period 2004-2014. Dislocated occupations are based on these projections and are established for all workforce regions.

An occupation would be **excluded** from the list if it had any of the following characteristics:

- ▶ Total employment for the occupation within the region totals 5 or less, **or**
- ▶ The occupation only requires short term on-the-job training, **or**
- ▶ The competitive level of education required of the job is more than just a Bachelor's degree.

The first exclusive characteristic eliminates occupations which likely have a larger labor market area beyond the region. The second characteristic takes out those occupations in which workers are likely to quickly obtain similar paying jobs. The third exclusive characteristic takes out more occupations which also may have a larger labor market area beyond the region.

An occupation would be **included** in the list if it had any of the following characteristics:

- ▶ The occupation is projected to lose employment over the ten-year projection period, **or**
- ▶ The ratio of total openings to 2004 employment must be half or less of the region's average ratio, **and** the growth rate must be less than one third of the region's overall growth rate.

These are occupations that have limited reemployment opportunities due to both relatively few openings and slow growth.
