The Easter Egg Roll is an annual White House tradition starting in 1878 with President Rutherford B. Hayes, although informal rolling parties on the White House Lawn were earlier held by President Lincoln, President Johnson and President Grant.

After 1878, the White House Easter Egg Roll continued to grow and by 1889 there were some 8,000 children on the Lawn for the event which included the playing of egg games such as "Egg Ball," "Toss and Catch" and "Egg Croquet."

Now each year thousands of children await the chance to participate in the Easter Egg Roll, the largest public event held at the White House, while listening to music such as the Marine Band and learning about the springtime traditions of other countries.

While the games from President Hayes' days have been replaced by newer activities, such as seeing favorite TV programs come to life, listening to authors read their books and having photographs taken with favorite characters, rolling an egg across the White House grass is still a highlight for children in any year.
