The Campus Challenge: The First List Release for the Best Workplaces for Commuters Colleges and Universities Sector

Heads (and mortarboards) up: Best Workplaces for Commuters is launching a *Campus Challenge*. We want to build on the over 65 colleges and universities who have achieved the designation as Best Workplaces for Commuters. By offering comprehensive commuter benefits, these campuses have reduced parking demand, saved energy and millions of dollars, maximized tax benefits, reduced traffic and congestion in their communities, and have helped to improve air quality and reduce greenhouse gases. Now is an ideal time to encourage additional campuses to apply. Those institutions for higher education that apply and qualify by April 30 will be included in the Best Workplaces for Commuters list release for universities in late spring.

Actions you can take as part of the Campus Challenge:

- 1. **Consider** which colleges and universities you are aware of that have commuting issues that have risen to your attention, or tend to be at the cutting edge in employee benefits, or simply that draw large numbers of commuters in your region.
- 2. Directly contact them to let them know about Best Workplaces for Commuters Campus Challenge, and let them know we will have conference calls Thursday, March 16 and Wednesday, March 29, both at 2:30 Eastern Standard Time, "Why your College or University Should Achieve the Best Workplaces for Commuters Designation," to outline the program.
