hy do they do it? Why do many Corps employees of the Huntington District as well as employees throughout the Corps volunteer for service in Iraq? Why do many of them extend their initial tour of duty, and why do many of them take additional tours? Perhaps the answer is in the wording on the sign pictured here: "We Came, We Saw, We Rebuilt."

The primary mission of the Forat Area Office is to rebuild. The geographic scope of that mission includes the Iragi provinces of Babil, Karbala, Najaf, Qadisiyah, and Wasit. This comprises the heartland of Iraq. Forat is the Arabic word meaning heartland. Projects completed or currently means of expressing the gratitude of the other Corps employees in the in process include Buildings, Health, and Education, 50; Water, 35; Communications, 19; Electrical, 7; Security, 108. These include police stations, schools, hospitals, and others.



The sign was the brain-child of Allen Diaz (left back row). It was his design, and was painted in honor of LTC Greg Raimondo (2nd from right, back row), who was at the time of the photo serving at Gulf Region South (GRS) District as Deputy Commander for the Forat Area Office.
