Included is a digital gallery of images from *A New World Trade Center: Design Proposals*. In collaboration with the editors of *Architectural Record*, New York gallery owner Max Protetch has solicited sixty proposals from architects worldwide. The results have been the subject of subsequent exhibitions at the National Building Museum and the Venice Biennale. The Library of Congress is acquiring the entire archive and related materials.
