CONGRESSMAN DAVID DAVIS SAYS NO TO DISTRICT WORK PERIOD, RETURNS TO WASHINGTON AND CALLS FOR UP OR DOWN VOTE ON AMERICAN ENERGY

Washington, DC -- Congressman David Davis will be returning to Washington, D.C. despite the five week adjournment vote, which passed last week by a single vote. Congressman David Davis will join other colleagues on the House Floor even though Leadership in Washington has shut off the cameras, microphones and lights in the People's House. Congressman David Davis issued the following statement:

"The American people are hurting. Small businesses are hurting, young families are hurting, seniors are hurting, people living on a fixed income are hurting," said Congressman David Davis. "It is time to stand up for the American people and give them an up-or-down vote on more American energy," Davis added while noting that Leadership in Washington shut off the lights, turned off the microphones and cameras, and tried to silence pro-American energy Members of Congress on August 1, 2008.

"This isn't, nor shouldn't, be a partisan issue. People aren't looking for red states and blue states, they are looking for red, white and blue states to come together and find a solution to America's energy crisis; a solution that involves American energy, alternative and renewable fuels, and increased conservation efforts," added Congressman David Davis who also noted that he just completed a two day district gas station tour.
