Thank you for your letter requesting additional information from this Department as a follow-up to the May 13, 2003 GAO report, "Federal Funds: Fiscal Year 2001 Expenditures by Selected Organizations Involved in Health-Related Activities" (GAO-03-527R).


According to our data, four Departmental agencies provided \$24.192 million in direct discretionary funding to five of the organizations included in the GAO report: Advocates for Youth, the Alan Guttmacher Institute, Planned Parenthood Federation of America and its affiliates, The Population Council Inc., and the Sex Information & Educational Council of the U.S. Please refer to the enclosed chart for specific data on these awards.

Not reflected on the chart, but also material to your inquiry, is funding provided by the Department's Office of Population Affairs in the Office of Public Health and Science, which administers the Public Health Service Act/Title X family planning program. This program's direct grantees are state, local and territorial health departments, and non-profit organizations, who in turn re-allocate funding to Planned Parenthood affiliates, referred to as "delegates." The total provided to Planned Parenthood delegates through this mechanism in Fiscal Year 2001 was \$40.231 million.

No grantee-specific data is collected or otherwise available to us concerning funding provided by HHS agencies directly to states through other programs noted in the GAO report, - the Social Services Block Grant, the Maternal and Child Health Block Grant, or through Medicaid reimbursements to these organizations.
