Joyce Rudick is currently the Director of Programs and Management in the Office of Research on Women's Health, Office of the Director, NIH and was the former Acting Deputy Director. She oversees the Interdisciplinary Research and Career Development Programs, additional Career Development Programs, the newly developed Intramural Program on Research on Women's Health (IPRWH), all Outreach programs and serves as Executive Secretary of the two ORWH chartered committees. She also cochairs the Women's Health Seminar Series Committee. She is a member of the NIH Roadmap Clinical Research Workforce Committee.
