

What is the purpose?

CRISP is a searchable database that tracks federally funded biomedical research projects that are supported by the Department of Health and Human Services. While no specific funding dollar information is available, the scientific information available is only for funded projects.

What are the features of CRISP?

 CRISP allows users to search for scientific concepts, emerging trends and techniques, or identify specific projects and/or investigators

Users may access CRISP by Institute and/or Center (IC), area of the country, science area, Integrated Review Group, fiscal year etc.

What is the benefit?

The Grant Closeout feature keeps track of the multiple reports needed to close out a grant and reminds grantees of the importance of providing the Federal Government with accurate and timely information.

Who can use the CRISP module?

This is a public site, with no authorization requirements.
