About Tonight's Presenters

Adam I. Levine, M.D.

Dr. Adam 1. Levine graduated summa cum laude from Clark University in Worcester, Massachusetts, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He attended Mount Sinal School of Medicine, and he stayed at Mount Sinai to complete an internship in medicine and a residency in the Department of Anesthesiology, where he was appointed Chief Resident. He is now Clinical Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology at Mount Sinai, and he also is Director of Residency Training and Director of Human Simulation in Anesthesiology.

Among his honors, he was named Teacher of the Year in 1994-95, and again in 1996-97. Dr. Levine is a Diplomat of the American Board of Anesthesiology.

Dr. Levine has given his signature lecture, "Simulation from Aviation to Anesthesia," at local area hospitals, including Beth Israel Medical Center, and as an invited professor at the Baylor University Department of Anesthesiology in Houston. He also presented the lecture in 1997 at a conference in Acapulco.

Jeffrey H. Silverstein, M.D.

Dr. Jeffrey Silverstein is Director of the Division of Geriatric Anesthesia in the Department of Anesthesiology at Mount Sinai. On staff at Mount Sinai since 1991, he holds joint appointments in the Departments of Geriatrics and Adult Development and Anesthesiology and Surgery.

A native of Canada, Dr. Silverstein earned his M.D. at the University of Extremadura, in Badajoz, Spain. Following residencies in internal medicine and general surgery at Interfaith Medical Center in Brooklyn, and in surgery and anesthesiology at Brookdale Hospital Medical Center, also in Brooklyn, he completed a fellowship in anesthesia/critical care medicine at The Mount Sinai Hospital. He was named Fellow of the Year in the Surgical Intensive Care Unit in 1991, and received the Resident Research Award from the Department of Anesthesiology that same year. In 1993 he received the Anesthesiology Department's Attending Research Award.

Dr. Silverstein has served as founding president of the resident section of the New York State Society of Anesthesiologists. Among his many professional activities, he was a delegate to the New York Governor's Conference on Aging and an alternate delegate to the White House Conference on Aging, and he is a member of the American College of Physician Executives. An internationally recognized expert on the care of elderly patients needing surgery and on geriatric trauma patients, Dr. Silverstein has lectured extensively on those and other topics throughout the country and abroad.
