### Place Qualifiers

Add to the name of a local church, cathedral, monastery, convent, abbey, temple, mosque, synagogue, etc., the name of the place in which it is located.

**Eglise Saint-Jean-Baptiste (Bourbourg, France)** 

Bethel Baptist Church (Washington County, Ky.)

Tenafly Presbyterian Church (Tenafly, N.J.)

### Parish Church of Limpsfield (Limpsfield, England)

*Note 1*: Headings already coded for AACR 2 that lack a qualifier called for by this directive should not be changed unless a conflict or some other extreme need arises.

*Note* 2: Before 1995, references were made from the place in which the local religious institution is located. Delete such references when maintenance work is required to the authority record for another reason.

## Multiple Qualifiers

If the name needs the addition of both a general designation and the name of the place, add the general designation first.

### Santo Domingo (Monastery: Pamplona, Spain)

Churches, Chapels, etc., of Larger Institutions

If a church, chapel, etc., is a subordinate unit of a larger institution and is entered directly under its own name (24.12), generally add the name of the larger institution as a qualifier. Make a reference from the name as a subheading of the larger institution.

## MUSIC CATALOGING DECISIONS

## **MUSIC CATALOGING DECISIONS (MCD)**

Cumulative index of MCD to the *Anglo-American Cataloguing Rules*, second edition, 1998 revision, that have appeared in issues of *Cataloging Service Bulletin*. Other MCD are in effect but have not appeared in *Cataloging Service Bulletin*. Lines (|) in the margins of revised interpretations indicate where changes have occurred.

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### 5.1B1. TITLE PROPER

In applying this rule, be governed by the definition of "name of a type of composition" in 25.27A1, footnote 9.

Apply the second sentence of this rule to titles consisting of the names of two or more types of composition only when each of the types named constitutes a more or less distinct part of the work or item. (In such cases the names of types are usually connected by a conjunction or other linking word.)

When a title consists of two words each of which alone would be the name of a type of composition, but the combination of the two words produces a distinctive title, apply the third sentence of this rule ("In all other cases ...").

Note, however, that "trio sonata" (cf. 25.29C1) and "chorale prelude" are each the name of *one* type of composition.

### 5.2B2. EDITION STATEMENT

When a song, song cycle, or set or collection of songs bears a statement designating the voice range (as distinguished from a statement of medium of performance) that is not grammatically linked to the title, other title information, etc., transcribe the statement as an edition statement, whether or not it includes the word "edition" or its equivalent.

## 5.5B1. EXTENT OF ITEM (INCLUDING SPECIFIC MATERIALS DESIGNATION)

For clarifications of the definitions of the terms "chorus score" and "vocal score," see MCD Appendix D.

If neither "chorus score," "close score," nor "vocal score" applies to a vocal publication, use "score" or "miniature score" (unless the item is for an unaccompanied solo voice or unaccompanied unison voices).

While the specific material designation terms listed following the first paragraph of this rule (score, condensed score, etc.) are to be applied to entire physical units, this is not true of the phrase "of music" in the third paragraph. When "of music" is used, apply the phrase only to those sequences (for the definition of "sequence" see 2.5B2, footnote 2) which are, or consist primarily of, music, and not to sequences which are primarily text.

Do not use "sheet" in describing music. Describe leaves printed on one side only in terms of leaves, whether they are bound, folded, or separate.

## 5.7B1. NOTE AREA. FORM OF COMPOSITION AND MEDIUM OF PERFORMANCE.

Do not name the medium of performance in a note if it is implied by the title or other title information (e.g., "Chorale prelude"; "Manfred: symphonie en 4 tableaux") or by the musical form stated in a note made under this rule (e.g., "Opera in two acts"; "Ballet").

If a work is published for a medium of performance other than the original, give the original medium of performance in a note if it is not clear from the rest of the description or the uniform title and the information is readily available.

If an item is described in the physical description area as "chorus score" or "vocal score" (cf. MCD 5.5B1), give in a note the original medium of performance and the instrument for which the accompaniment is arranged (or indicate that the accompaniment is omitted) if this information is not clear from the rest of the description.

## 5.7B10. NOTE AREA. DURATION OF PERFORMANCE AND PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION.

In a statement of duration in the note area, separate the digits representing hours, minutes, and seconds by colons. If a duration is expressed in seconds only, precede it by a colon.

## 5.7B19. NOTE AREA. PUBLISHER'S NUMBERS AND PLATE NUMBERS.

When a designation such as "no.," "Nr.," "cat. no.," "Ed. Nr.," etc., appears with a publisher's number or plate number, do not consider it to be part of the number and do not transcribe it. If, however, initials, abbreviations, or words identifying the publisher also appear with the number, follow the instructions in LCRI 5.7B19 and transcribe the entire statement as it appears.

## 5.7B20. NOTE AREA. COPY BEING DESCRIBED, LIBRARY'S HOLDINGS, AND RESTRICTIONS ON USE.

For notes on special features or imperfections of the copy being described (e.g., if the LC set has fewer or more parts than the number recorded in the physical description area according to 5.5B2), follow the instructions in LCRI 1.7B20.

### 5.8D1. TERMS OF AVAILABILITY.

When cataloging a rental score or rental performance materials received through copyright deposit, give the note "Rental material" in field 020, 024, or 037, to indicate to other libraries that the item is not available for purchase.

#### 6.7B10. TYPE OF RECORDING

Do not make the note "Analog recording" or "Digital recording."

#### **Durations**

Generally do not give more than six statements of duration in the note area. If durations of more than six works in a collection are available from the item, generally do not give any durations in the note area. More than six durations may be given, however, if in the cataloger's judgment they are especially important.

In a statement of duration in the note area, separate the digits representing hours, minutes, and seconds by colons. If a duration is expressed in seconds only, precede it by a colon.

#### **Containers**

Give a note on the presence of container(s) only when the number of containers is not clear from the rest of the description.

### 6.7B18. CONTENTS

Use judgment in deciding whether to include in a contents note titles of parts, titles proper of individual works within each part, parallel titles, other title information, statements of responsibility, performers, etc. Take into account the type of music or other recorded sound, the emphasis of the set, the amount of data to be transcribed, and the length, complexity, and readability of the resulting note.

If two or more titles are being transcribed for one part of a multipart item, apply the punctuation conventions from 1.1G3 so that titles by the same person, body, etc., are separated by a space-semicolon-space and titles by different persons, bodies, etc., are separated by a period-space. *Exception*: if no statements of responsibility are being transcribed, separate the titles with a space-semicolon-space.

## 6.7B19. PUBLISHER'S NUMBERS

When a publisher's number appears in variant forms on a sound recording, its container, accompanying material, etc., transcribe only the form on the recording itself (e.g., the labels of a disc).

When an item consists of two or more individual units (e.g., discs), do not transcribe numbers which represent in a truncated form the numbers of the individual units.

When two or more distinct publisher's numbers appear on a sound recording, its container, accompanying material, etc., transcribe each in a separate note. Follow each number other than the first by an indication of its location, if appropriate.

If, however, each unit (e.g., disc) in a set bears an individual number but the item also bears a number applying to the set as a whole, follow the instructions in LCRI 6.7B19.

Apply the above principles also when a disc (or discs) bears only matrix numbers but a different or variant number appears on the container.

## SUBJECT CATALOGING

### **SUBDIVISION SIMPLIFICATION PROGRESS**

Since the Subject Subdivisions Conference took place at Airlie House, Virginia, in May 1991, progress continues to be made in simplifying subdivisions in the Library of Congress Subject Headings system. On Weekly Lists 00-15 to 00-26, changes were made in the following areas:

**Recommendation** #1. Toward achieving the recommended standard order of **[topic]—[place]—[chronology]—[form]** where it can be applied in LC subject heading strings, new topical subdivisions for which geographic orientation is possible are established with the designation (*May Subd Geog*). On a case-by-case basis, subdivisions not previously divided by place are authorized for geographic subdivision. Nine subdivisions were authorized for geographic subdivision during this period, including four free-floating subdivisions listed below.

*Recommendation #6.* During the second quarter of 2000, progress in simplifying subdivisions was made in the following areas:

- 1) Phrase headings replaced with subdivisions. The phrase heading Aircraft industry workers was replaced with the heading/subdivision combination Aircraft industry—Employees. The subdivision —Employees is authorized for free-floating use under types of industries.
- 2) Subdivisions updated to different forms. The subdivision —Aircraft industry workers was changed to —Aircraft industry under the heading Wages. Industries are the preferred

formulation for subdivisions under the heading Wages.

The subdivision —**Assaults against**, which was authorized for free-floating use under classes of persons and ethnic groups, was revised to —**Violence against**.

The chronological subdivision —War of 1812 was revised to the explicit date span —1812-1815 under six headings: Connecticut—Politics and government; Massachusetts—Politics and government; —New England—Politics and government; New Hampshire—Politics and government; New Jersey—Politics and government; and New York (State)—Politics and government. Generally, chronological subdivisions established under headings of the type [place]—Politics and government do not contain descriptive terms.

The following changes to existing free floating subdivision took place during the second quarter of 2000.
