ALEXANDER URGES FINAL PASSAGE OF HIGHWAY BILL

OVER \$20 MILLION SECURED IN FEDERAL FUNDING

Washington, D.C. --U.S. Rep. Rodney Alexander, R-Quitman, said that passage of the HR 3 --H Rept 109-203 (Highway Bill) will tremendously impact the 5th Congressional District and is **''long overdue.''**

The bill contains significant funding for the following 5th District projects:

Kansas Garrett Connector (Monroe)	\$12.35 Million
Hwy. 820 (Lincoln Parish)	\$2.8 Million
Third Street Renovation Project (Alexandria)	\$2.8 Million

Transportation Corridor Program (Lincoln Parish) \$5.5 Million

"The 5th District has been in need of federal funding for these projects for years," Alexander said.

"I know that this funding will ultimately lead to a shot in the arm for the 5th District's economy. I want to thank Sen. David Vitter for protecting these numbers in conference and also for adding dollars to these projects."

The Highway Bill, which would renew federally funded infrastructure projects, will continue through the 2009 fiscal year.

The bill currently authorizes funding at \$286 billion.

The Conference Report passed the U.S. House of Representatives by a vote of 412-8. Alexander said the that the Senate will most likely approve the Highway Bill today or tomorrow.
