Washington, D.C. -- U.S. Rep. Rodney Alexander, R-Quitman, took time this week to visit with Patricia R. (Pat) Jones, 75, executive director of Allen Parish's Council on Aging, located in Oakdale.

Jones and her husband have owned and operated a printing plant in Oakdale for 45 years. Jones was recognized by Experience Works, the nation's largest provider of training and employment services for older workers.
