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Patsy M. Brannon, PhD, RD is a Professor of Nutritional Sciences and Director of the Dietetic Internship at Cornell University and a Visiting Professor at the National Institute of Health Office of Dietary Supplements (2007-2008). She served as the Rebecca Q. and James C. Morgan Dean of the College of Human Ecology at Cornell (1999-2004) and the Chair of the Department of Nutrition and Food Science at the University of Maryland – College Park (1994-99). Her research focuses on diet and gene regulation in the exocrine pancreas and placenta. The current focus of her research is on the mechanisms whereby maternal under- and over- nutrition alters the regulation of placental growth and its relationship to adverse outcomes to the fetus and adult offspring. She teaches nutrition and the life cycle and developmental nutrition.
