

Kevin T. FitzGerald, S.J., Ph.D.

Fr. FitzGerald is the Dr. David Lauler Chair in Catholic Health Care Ethics at Georgetown University and a Research Associate Professor in the Department of Oncology at Georgetown University Medical Center. Prior to joining Georgetown University, Fr. FitzGerald was on the faculty of the Strich School of Medicine at Loyola University with dual appointments in the Institute for Bioethics and Health Policy and the Department of Medicine. His scholarship in bioethics has focused on the human genome project and the implications of genetic technologies. His scientific area of interest is the characterization and functional analysis of oncogenes. Fr. FitzGerald has served as an ethics consultant for the National Society of Genetic Counselors since 1992 and the March of Dimes Research Foundation since 2002. He is a member of the advisory committee to the AAAS Dialogue on Science, Ethics, and Religion Program. Fr. FitzGerald earned doctorates in molecular genetics and in bioethics from Georgetown University and a Master of Divinity degree from the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley.
