Subj: Notification of Policy Changes Related to HSR&D Proposal Submissions

To: VAMC Directors (00/151)

- 1. **REASON FOR ISSUE**: HSR&D has implemented changes in the proposal submission limit per review cycle and Institutional Review Board Approval process effective immediately.
- 2. **SUMMARY OF MAJOR CHANGES:** The principal changes clarify and incorporate additional information on Investigator Initiated Research (IIR) proposal submission and Final Report requirements. Specific new information includes:
 - a. **Proposal Limit**: VHA HANDBOOK 1204.01, 5. Project Proposals, c. General Instructions, page 5 (2). <u>Proposal Limit</u> states "A proposed Principal Investigator (PI) may submit only one application to HSR&D per review cycle." Effective with the November 1, 2003 submission date, HSR&D will accept more than one application from a PI in the same cycle without a written request for an exception to the above-stated policy.
 - b. **Just in Time: Institutional Review Board Approval**: VHA Handbook 1204.01, Appendix B, page B-7 k and l. VA Form 10-1223 "Report of Subcommittee on Human Studies" and VA Form 10-1086 "VA Research Consent Form and Related Documentation" [*states*] "Proposals for studies involving human subjects *will not be reviewed* unless or until approved by the VA facility's Subcommittee on Human Studies or, if none, by the institutional review board (IRB) of the affiliated university."

HSR&D has adopted the Just in Time policy of accepting proposals for review without IRB approval, consistent with Dr. Wray's announcement on the August 11 hotline call. However, HSR&D continues to require a *draft* informed consent (Form 10-1086 or a university approved form) with the proposal. Certification of completed human subjects protection training for the PI, Co-PI and key investigators is still required at the time of application. IRB approval must be received prior to the disbursement of funds.

c. **Final Reports:** VHA Handbook 1204.5 Appendix B, page B-5 section 7.b "Copies". The number of final report copies required by HSR&D has been reduced.

When submitting Final Reports to Health Services Research and Development Service (HSR&D), please submit only:

1. The original **unbound** final report (including executive summary),

- 2. One photocopy (includes reports with color printing) and
- 3. One electronic copy (on 3.5" diskette or CD).
