#### **Technical comments:**<sup>5</sup>

As noted by footnote 4 on the first page of this report, the bill purports to extend an existing duty suspension under HTS heading 9902.25.66. However, heading 9902.25.66 is actually a temporary duty reduction. This information in this report reflects the extension of that duty reduction.

<sup>2/</sup> There is an existing duty reduction under HTS heading 9902.25.66 that expires on December 31, 2009. Therefore, there will be no additional customs revenue loss related to this bill for 2009. Source of estimated dutiable import data: U.S. industry estimates.

The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.
