Plasticizers containing diphenyl cresyl phosphate (CAS No. 26444-49-5), triphenyl phosphate (CAS No. 115-86-6), tricresyl phosphate (CAS No. 1330-78-5), and phenyl dicresyl phosphate (CAS No. 26446-73-1) (provided for in subheading 3812.20.10).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject products are mixtures of synthetic organic chemicals that are used as plasticizers in polyvinyl chloride (PVC), polyurethane foams, phenolic resins, and synthetic rubbers. They are imported from Germany.

- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.24.61 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 certain plasticizers) is amended by striking "12/31/2009"
- 7 and inserting "12/31/2011".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
